15	Comes now the Guam Department of Education ("GDOE") and submits this Request for	
16	Clarification and Request for Extension of Termination. Given the urgency of the circumstance	
17	faced by GDOE as explained below, GDOE respectfully requests that the Public Auditor issue a	
18	immediate response to these requests.	
19	REQUEST FOR CLARIFICATION	
20	After a hearing on the merits in this matter, a Final Administrative Decision was issued b	
21	the Office of Public Accountability ("OPA") on August 8, 2012. The Decision contains the	
22	following statements:	
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24	2. The quantities stated in Purchase Order No. 201100024 increased the quantities stated in the IFB in violation of Paragraph 22 of the IFB's General Terms and Conditions.	
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Request for Clarification; Request for Extension of Termination

- 3. DOE Purchase Order No. 201100024's reference to XEROX Response and Services & Solutions Agreement No. 7099405 was improper because DOE had not executed said agreement.
- 4. DOE Purchase Order Nos. 201100024 and 201200367 are hereby terminated and DOE shall compensate XEROX for the actual expenses XEROX reasonably incurred under the contract, plus a reasonable profit, prior to termination, pursuant to 5 G.C.A. §5452(a)(1)(ii) and Chapter IX, Section 9.7.1.1, DOE Procurement Regulations. ¹

The Decision terminates the two purchase orders previously issued under GDOE IFB 022-2010 on the bases that the purchase orders included quantities that were increased over the quantities contained in the IFB and improperly included a reference to XEROX's Service Agreement. The Decision does not state that the IFB itself was improper, or that GDOE may not continue to issue purchase orders pursuant to the IFB so long as such purchase orders do not contain quantities in excess of the IFB or references to the XEROX Service Agreement. GDOE therefore requests the following clarification of the Decision: May GDOE continue to issue purchase orders pursuant to GDOE IFB022-2010 that do not contain quantities in excess of the IFB and that limit applicable terms and conditions to those contained in the IFB?

REQUEST FOR EXTENSION OF TERMINATION

In the event the OPA determines that GDOE may not continue to issue any purchase orders pursuant to GDOE IFB022-2010, GDOE then requests that the termination of the current purchase order be extended to allow GDOE adequate time to procure document management services. As quoted above, the Decision states that "DOE Purchase Order Nos. 201100024 and 201200367 are hereby terminated." Without further clarification, it is assumed the termination is effective upon the issuance of the Decision, or August 8, 2012. Purchase Order 201200367 is the order currently in effect, and it includes all large scale printers/copiers currently in use at GDOE's
