"The mission of the Guam Fire Department is to respond to and mitigate all threats to life, property, and the environment in the Territory of Guam and its surrounding waters". This will be accomplished through education, prevention, and an effective response to fire, medical, and environmental emergencies.

Statutory Basis

Upon the enactment of Public Law 1-88 in 1952, the Fire Division was created within the Department of Public Safety (DPS). On March 13, 1985, Public Law 17-78 separated the Fire Division from DPS and established the Guam Fire Department, a line agency of the Government of Guam. On March 6, 1996 Public Law 23-77 tasked the Guam Fire Department with the responsibility to administer and operate the Emergency 911 telephone communications system; regulated by the EMS Commission.

The Guam Fire Department is mandated to protect life and property from the perils of fire and other disasters. This could only be achieved through an accomplished fire prevention, suppression, and extinguishment plan. Furthermore, the formulation of a comprehensive Emergency Medical Services (EMS/Ambulance) Program, inclusive of an Advanced Life Support Intercept Program for the Territory of Guam, was required. An extensive Fire Prevention bureau overseeing fire inspections, new and existing building plan review and approval, investigations, code enforcement, and public education, was also established. Also entrusted to the Guam Fire Department were the responsibilities of land and sea search and rescue, operation and management of an enhanced Emergency 911 communications system, and more recently the addition of a dedicated hazardous materials response team. We are able to perform these missions by: "Promoting safety and maintaining a well equipped, highly trained, and motivated force of professional Firefighters/EMTs, EMDs, and Rescue Personnel.

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Goal

The Guam Fire Department will be a fire service nationally recognized and accredited in Fire Suppression, Fire Prevention, Emergency Medical Services, Search and Rescue, Hazardous Materials response and Emergency Medical Dispatch. At a minimum, every fire station will house a fire engine, ambulance, and some type of specialty response apparatus such as a water tanker, ladder truck, rescue unit, or advanced life support unit. Firefighters will be fully equipped and trained, both technically and physically, to respond to all emergencies that pose a threat to the safety of life and property.

National professional standards are aligned with promotional standards for the Guam Fire Department. Aside from all chief fire officers being NFPA/ProBoard certified Fire Officers, including the Fire Chief at Fire Officer 4 and credentialed as a Chief Fire Officer (CFO) by the Center for Public Safety and Excellence. The GFD Fire Marshal is fully qualified and credential as a CPSE Fire Marshal (FM), CPSE CFO, and NFPA/ProBoard Fire Officer 4. The Guam Fire Department continues to be led by fully qualified and nationally certified chief fire officers.

Our Finances



Revenues and Expenses



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What's Next *Key Initiatives*

Hafa Adai and thank you for taking the time to join us. The Guam Fire Department continues to strive for excellence in Fire Service on Guam. We have been hard at work to stay on track with the Guam Fire Department Blue Print 2020 while also looking for new opportunities.

Headquarters: Speaking of opportunity, we are still pursuing an avenue to construct a new Headquarters in the heart of Tamuning along with the construction of a new Tamuning Fire Station. We are collaborating with the Guam Economic Development Agency to rebuild a new station and HQ near the original location. We seek to take advantage of the property value of our current property to trade, finance and build a new and improved Fire Station and Headquarters. Annually we are applying for assistance to construct a Fire Station in the village of Sinajana.

Fire Suppression: The GFD has completed a procurement project be federal funding to place a structural fire pumper at every village fire station. This is a proud time in that every fire station is capable of servicing its primary and assisting response area with a full range of emergency response. Astumbo Fire Station was the latest station to receive a pumper.

Promotions/Hiring: The GFD finally promoted a number of personnel of all ranks. This is significant as we are now able to stay within span of control requirements in regards to command and control, safety and management. We have also brought on board several Emergency Medical Dispatchers to maintain manning requirements at our E911 Center. We continue to look forward to promotions of all positions in the near future. The Department will soon graduate 45 newly minted Firefighters.
