Comes now Guam Department of Education ("GDOE") and moves for an expedited hearing in OPA-PA-13-003.

## **BACKGROUND**

On February 25, 2013, GDOE issued GDOE Invitation for Bid 008-2013 ("IFB") for the Indefinite Quantity Bid for Purchase of Air Conditioning Equipment. The IFB was to replace air conditioner units that are beyond their life expectancy. On March 28, 2013, bids were accepted and a bid opening was conducted. On April 1, 2013, in response to protests filed by Phil-Gets (Guam) International Trading Corp. dba J&B Modern Tech ("J&B"), GDOE issued a Notice of Stay of the Procurement, and pursuant to 5 G.C.A. § 5425(g) and 2 G.A.R. Div 4 § 9101(e), GDOE took no further action on the IFB.

On April 3, 2013, GDOE issued a Written Response to J&B's First Protest and Second Protest denying both protests in their entirety. On April 5, 2013, J&B filed an appeal with the Office of Public Accountability ("OPA") regarding GDOE's denial of its protests.

GDOE has several air conditioner units cooling classrooms that have passed their life expectancy, and were set to be replaced by air conditioner units purchased through the IFB. GDOE has become aware that a couple of air conditioner units have been reported broken and unsalvageable at one school. GDOE notes that these irreparable air conditioner units cooled classrooms, and as a result of them being down, the air temperatures in these classrooms range from 80°F-84°F. GDOE acknowledges that these air conditioner units need to be completely replaced, and if not for the stay issued in the IFB, GDOE would purchase these replacement air conditioner units.

## **DISCUSSION**

GDOE asks the OPA to grant its Motion for Expedited Hearing. Public Law 28-45 is known as the Every Child is Entitled to an Adequate Public Education Act. Every Child is Entitled to an Adequate Public Education. 20 G.C.A. § 15136. Under Guam law, GDOE is required to keep all GDOE classrooms at an air temperature no greater than 78°F ("the Mandate"). *See* 1 G.C.A § 715(12)(f).

The IFB was specifically issued in order to purchase new air conditioner units to replace older air conditioner units that have passed their life expectancy. The threat of these older air conditioner units breaking down is eminent, if not already apparent. In addition, due to the stay in the IFB, GDOE lacks the ability to purchase any replacement air conditioner units.

If GDOE fails to comply with the Mandate, GDOE is open to suits for injunctive relief under the Every Child is Entitled to an Adequate Public Education Act. *See* 7 G.C.A. § 12108.1(a); 19 G.C.A. § 1116(b); 7 G.C.A. § 20302(8); P.L. 28-45. Furthermore, "any action or proceeding to enforce a provision of the Every Child is Entitled to an Adequate Public Education

Act, a court, in its discretion, may allow the prevailing party reasonable attorney's fees as part of the costs." 7 G.C.A. § 26603.1.

GDOE has pointed out that a couple air conditioner units have already broke down, and have left classrooms with air temperatures ranging from 80°F-84°F – well above the mandated temperature of 78°F. If not for the stay issued in the IFB, GDOE would outright purchase new air conditioner units to replace units that have broken down beyond repair. Therefore, GDOE respectfully asks the OPA to expedite hearing the matter in OPA-PA-13-003 in order to prevent GDOE from falling into non-compliance of the Every Child is Entitled to an Adequate Public Education Act.

## **CONCLUSION**

For the foregoing reasons, GDOE respectfully requests that the Office of Public Accountability grant GDOE's Motion for an Expedited Hearing.
