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THIS MATTER came before the Public Auditor on May 20, 2013 for a hearing on the Purchasing Agency's Motion for Reconsideration and for Clarification of the Decision in this matter. The Purchasing Agency was represented by its Counsel of Record, Assistant Attorney General John M. Weisenburger, Esq. The Appellant was represented by its Counsel of Record, Kevin J. Fowler, Esq. The Appellant did not oppose the aforementioned motions. The Purchasing Agency presented the testimony of Edward Artero, Fire Lieutenant, Guam Fire Department (GFD), Claudia Acfalle, Chief Procurement Officer, General Service Agency,

Department of Administration, Government of Guam (GSA), and Paul N.I. Cepeda, Superintendent, Transportation Maintenance, Department of Public Works, Government of Guam, and John Wusstig, Acting Fire Chief, GFD.

After hearing the aforementioned Testimony and the arguments of the parties, the Public Auditor is not persuaded as to the cost-effectiveness of sending two (2) firemen with minimal to no mechanical experience for pre and post inspection trips. In light of rising deficits and potential federal sequestration of federal grants, of which funding for this fire equipment will come from, department heads have a duty to be ever-mindful of declining local and federal grants and must use tax payer funds prudently. However, it is not the Public Auditor's role to dictate how an agency should spend federal grants allocated to it. Accordingly, the Public Auditor hereby ORDERS the following:

- 1. The Purchasing Agency's Motion for Reconsideration is hereby GRANTED. The GSA may include in Multi-Step Bid No. GSA-005-13 (New and Current Year, Custom Cab-Forward Pumpers, New and Current Year, Urban/Wildland Interface Pumpers, and 5-Year Extended Service/Maintenance Agreements) (Hereafter referred to as "IFB"), at the discretion of GFD, a requirement for two (2) factory inspection trips, a pre-construction conference and a final inspection, for two (2) GFD representatives, who shall be the person or representative of the committee that developed the IFB Specifications and the GFD's chief mechanic. GFD must be mindful of the Government of Guam's austere finances and do all it can to reduce the costs of procuring the new fire trucks the IFB is soliciting.
- 2. If GFD decides to include the aforementioned requirement in the IFB, GSA shall ensure said requirement is transparent by placing it in the proposed contract terms instead of the specifications.
- 3. GSA shall have additional time to amend the IFB which shall expire at 5:00 p.m. on May 23, 2013.
- 4. All other provisions of the Public Auditor's April 19, 2013 Decision in this matter shall remain in full force and effect.
 - 5. This is a Final Administrative Decision. The Parties are hereby informed of their
