BOX DE HAGATNA, GUAM 96932 3 TEL: 475-0658 FAX: 472-5003 4 PROCUREMENT APPEAL 5 6 In the Appeal of APPEAL NO.: OPA-PA-09-002 7 TEAL PACIFIC, LLC, **MOTION TO DISMISS** 8 Appellant. 9 COMES NOW the Guam Public School System through Legal Counsel, Fred 10 Nishihira, moving the Public Auditor to dismiss the appeal of Teal Pacific, LLC ("Appellant") 11 filed on April 28, 2009, on the basis that on February 12, 2009 GPSS issued IFB No. 12 004-2009, on March 16, 2009 a Letter of Stay was issued by our Procurement Officer (see 13 Attachment A). On the same date, GPSS received a letter from Appellant's attorney from 14 GPSS that they were protesting GPSS's decision (see Attachment B). On March 25, 2009, 15 GPSS issued a letter informing Appellant that the protest was rejected (see Attached C). On 16 April 28, 2009, Appellant filed an appeal with the Office of the Public Auditor. 17 **ARGUMENT** 18 The Appellant has failed to submit a timely appeal to Office of the Public Auditor and 19 therefore should be dismissed. Appeals of an Agency decision should be made within 15 days 20 of the department's issuance of a decision. 5 GCA Section 5425(e) states: 21 (e) **Appeal.** A decision under Subsection (c) of this Section including a decision 22 there under regarding entitlement to costs as provided by Subsection (h) of this Section, may be appealed by the protestant, to the Public Auditor within fifteen 23 (15) days after receipt by the protestant of the notice of decision. 24

Appellant as well as representative, Legal Counsel, William Gavras was involved in this protest since March 16, 2009. In Appellant's appeal filed with the Office of the Public Auditor on April 28, 2009, an argument was made that the statute of limitation should be waived as GPSS failed to inform the Appellant that fifteen (15) days was the statute of limitation established by law. GPSS argues that the purpose that Appellant secures the services of Legal Counsel was to ensure that all procedures are properly complied with. The appeal filed with Office of the Public Auditor was nineteen (19) days late. The day that the Appellant should have filed for an appeal with Office of the Public Auditor is April 9, 2009.

CONCLUSION

Appellant has failed to comply with the statute of limitations for filing an appeal within the fifteen (15) day time limit established by 5 GCA Section 5425(e). Based on the aforementioned facts and statements on this appeal should be dismissed.

On behalf of Teal Pacific LLP (Teal) please accept the following as a PROTEST of the above referenced Invitation To Bid (ITB).

On March 12, 2009, Teal received information from the Government of Guam that it was failed to win the bid on Item No. 114. Teal and National Office Supply, who also bid on this Item, tied for the lowest bid at \$38.00/case. On that same day it was revealed to Teal that National Office Supply would be awarded (or recommended for award for) Item No. 114. The explanation given for Teal having lost is that the National Office Supply was given preference and/or consideration as a local supplier under Guam law favoring Local Procurement Preference (5 GCA section 5008 and DOE procurement regulations).

Teal protests on the basis that the local procurement law(s) which gave National Office Supply an advantage over Teal violated Teal's equal protection rights afforded by

the Constitution of the United States of America as well as the Organic Act of Guam. The reasons for such violations include but are not limited to:

1. the fact that the purpose of the law is not legitimate;

2. local businesses suffer no disadvantages over non-local businesses;

3. the Government of Guam creates no disadvantages to local business;

4. there is no heavier burden on local business doing business in Guam than on non-local businesses;

5. local business are not at a competitive disadvantage with businesses from other areas:


6. the means adopted to pursue any assumed legitimate end were not reasonable,

measured or appropriate

7. the definition of and criteria for those benefiting and to be benefited by the local preference under Guam law is not a rational, measured, reasonable or appropriate definition in order to achieve any of the assumed legitimate ends of the applicable law.

Dear Mr. Gavras,

Buenas Yan Saludas! The Department is in receipt of your protest letter dated March 16, 2009 and received on the same.

This letter is in response to your protest letter regarding the bid award of item number 114. The responses are made in light of your contentions.

Please be advised that your submittal was rejected because it was not in total compliance with the award evaluation procedures.

On page 2, titled: "SPECIAL REMINDER TO PROSPECTIVE BIDDERS", item #6, which states, "Local Procurement Preference application qualifying on section number 2 & 3 only. Failure to indicate qualification on sections 2 & 3 and to complete and sign application will result in disqualification of this preference."

Pursuant to the Guam Public School System Procurement Regulation (GPSS Procurement Regulation Section 1.7) (GSA Section 1-104/GCA Section 5008) which states in part, "All procurement of supplies and services shall be made from among business licensed to do business on Guam and that maintain an office or other facility on Guam, whenever a business that is willing to be a contractor is:

- 2. A business that regularly carries an inventory for regular immediate sale of at least fifty percent (50%) of the items of supplies to be procured;
- 3. A business that has a bona fide retail or wholesale business location that regularly carries an inventory on Guam of a value of at least one half of the value of the bid or one hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000), which ever is less, of supplies and items of a similar nature to those being sought; or

Teal Pacific, LLC chose not to mark or identify what section identifying whether they elect to have local procurement preference or not instead marked their document N/A.

Furthermore, GPSSPR Section 3.9.15.1 (GSA Section 3-202.15.1) titled, "DEFINITION" states that, "Low tie bids are low responsive bids from responsible bidders that are identical in price and which meet all the requirements and criteria set forth in the Invitation for Bids".

In addition, GPSSPR Section 3.9.15.2 (GSA Section 3-202.15.2) titled, "AWARD" states, "Award shall not be made by drawing lots, except as set forth below, or by dividing business among identical bidders. In the discretion of the Superintendent of Education, award shall be made in any permissible manner that will discourage tie bids. If no permissible method will be effective in discouraging tie bids and a written determination is made so stating, award may be made by drawing lots."

In regards to the Local Procurement Preference which is a requirement to the bid awarding process, the Buy American Act is applicable and a fifteen percent (15%) is added to the non-qualifying bidder. National Office qualified for the Local Procurement Preference and thus the lowest bidder.

Based on the aforementioned response, the Department hereby rejects your protest

Please be advised, that pursuant to the Guam Public School System's Procurement Regulation Section 9.2.8, you may request a reconsideration of this decision within ten (10) working days of receipt of this letter.
