Dear Ms. Brooks:

I am writing to formally appeal the decision of the General Services Agency in the matter of GSA Bid No. 0116-12. The timeline and facts as we know them are as follows:

- <u>August 14th 2012</u> The invitation for bid was published in the Marianas Variety.
- <u>August 20th 2012</u> Amendment #1 (extending the delivery date and canceling pre-bid conference requirement) was issued (attached)
- August 23rd 2012 Amendment #2 (to include "Special Provisions" Post Construction / Pre Shipment inspection") was issued on (attached)
- <u>August 24th 2012</u> Triple J made a request to extend the bid opening date for one week and to seek clarification on the indefinite quantity provision and seek clarification on Amendment #1 canceling Pre-Bid Conference requirement. (Attached)
- <u>August 27th 2012</u> Amendment #3 was issued on to change the bid opening date to. (attached)
- <u>September 4th 2012</u> Triple J made another request for an extension of the bid opening date to September 13th 2012 due to the fact that there was no pre

- <u>September 5th 2012</u> GSA issues a letter rejecting our request for an extension of the bid opening date. (attached)
- <u>September 5th 2012</u> Triple J files a protest on the grounds that GSA did not provide sufficient time to review specifications and amendments and submit questions, that GSA issue and amendment canceling the requirement for a pre bid conference and that GSA refused to accept a letter from us on August 27th 2012 asking for clarification on some of the bid specifications. (attached)
- <u>September 5th 2012</u> GSA issues Amendment #4 changing the bid opening date to September 12th, 2012. (attached)
- <u>September 12th 2012</u> at 10:00 AM the bid opening occurred. Triple J submitted a primary and alternate bid as well as a notification on our primary offer that explained that the side emergency door as required by the GSA bid specifications (Emergency Exits page 35, item 6 & 7) could be accommodated but it would decrease the seating capacity by 1 person to 83 passengers. Alternatively a flip seat could be installed which would increase the seating capacity to 86 but the space from the barrier would be decreased from 20" to 12".

We went on to explain that the side emergency exit although required by the GSA specifications was not a Federal Requirement and that GSA should consider forgoing this specification if the 84 passenger capacity was its primary concern. That said, this change would have had to be made prior to the bid opening through a bid amendment or the bid would have had to be canceled and re-bid.

- <u>September 14th 2012</u> Triple J submitted a request to GSA to review the bid proposal submitted by Morrico Equipment. Upon review we noted that Morrico had stated on their proposal that they complied with all specifications including the side emergency door exits and seating capacity as well as the required anti-corrosive rivets on all body panels. Further we did not notice any additional notations or options provided regarding the side emergency door exits and or the seating.
- October 9th 2012 GSA issued a Bid Status notification (attached) rejecting our bid due to "Non-conformance with the bid specifications". Specifically our bid was rejected because our bid included "flip seats" in front of the Side Emergency Door exits. (attached)

At the time we did not protest because we knew that Morrico Equipment, the other vendor, had a lower price and we had reviewed their bid wherein they had stated that they complied with all specifications including the side emergency door exits. Further the bid required (page 28 DISCREPANCIES LISTED, see attached) "Should any bidder have deviations from these specifications in this bid and cannot meet requirement of the specification, he shall submit a letter and attach it to the bid explaining the deviations. Failure to do so will cause the bid to be rejected as being non-responsive".

• June 3rd 2013 – We noticed the buses arrived and that they did not have the Side Emergency Door Exit as required by the bid. Immediately we filed a protest with GSA outlining our concerns that the buses did not have the required side emergency door exits nor did the buses have the required "anti-corrosive rivets" on all body parts as required on page 34 (under Construction item 3) (attached)

Furthermore we pointed out that these discrepancies should have been discovered during Post Construction / Pre Shipment inspection as required by Amendment # 2.

- June 4th 2013 GSA rejected our protest on the grounds that the 84 passenger capacity was more important than the side emergency door exit and that the flip seats were deemed to be "more dangerous". GSA went on to say that although the buses did not have the emergency side door exit they did have an "upper emergency door exit" which is absurd as there is no such thing. What they were referring to were the emergency roof hatches which are a separate bid specification requirement. GSA also stated the director of DPW acknowledged that there was an oversight by his office in not addressing these issues while the buses were still at the manufacturer even though it was raised by DPW personnel while there on site. In addition GSA stated that the DPW staff that were sent to the manufacturer did catch errors but "the errors were not fixed". In GSA's final paragraph they state that our observations are correct and that the manufacturer did not comply with the specifications even after they were pointed out by DPW personnel but because our protest was after the award we are limited to Remedies After Award as stated in 5 GCA Section 5452. And that the bidder has not acted fraudulently or in bad faith so the contract is ratified as in the best interest of the Territory. (attached)
- <u>June 10th 2013</u> Triple J replied to GSA's rejection notice and addressed and refuted each point that GSA gave as reasons why the buses should be accepted. We further questioned GSA's assertion that the winning bidder and/or manufacturer did not act fraudulently or in bad faith. The reason we questioned

this was based on the fact that the bidder stated that they complied with all the bid specifications when they did not and they even stated they complied with a specific bid specification (riveted body panels) that is not available from this manufacturer. Further when DPW personnel pointed out the discrepancies they still were not corrected prior to shipment. If that is not "bad faith" we are not sure of GSA's definition. Finally we requested that either the winning bidder correct the deficiencies and if that is not possible Triple J should be awarded the bid as the most responsible bidder. (attached)

- <u>June 28th 2013</u> GSA rejected our request for reconsideration and stood by their decision to deny our protest and stated we had the right to seek any administrative or judicial review authorized by law. (attached)
- <u>July 3rd 2013</u> Triple J acknowledges receipt of GSA's rejection of our protest and informed GSA that we would be filing an appeal with the Office of the Public Auditor. We further requested, under the Sunshine Act all correspondence between GSA and DPW on this matter. (attached)

As you can see from the above chronology of events many of the questions, concerns and discrepancies could have been avoided if GSA had not canceled the pre-bid conference where many of these issues could have been discussed and vetted. Unfortunately for whatever reason the pre-bid conference never occurred and GSA allowed an unreasonably short time for questions to be posed. In one specific instance GSA refused to accept a written request for clarification of the bid requirements.

GSA's position that our protest has no merit because the award was already made is illogical and ignores the fact that we could not have protested prior to the arrival of the buses because we could not have known of the deficiencies. On the other hand DPW was derelict in their responsibilities when they inspected the buses prior to shipment, noted the deficiencies and still allowed the buses to be shipped. Moreover if deficiencies were in fact noted and supposed to be corrected before shipment and were not then there is further grounds for GSA and DPW to reject the buses and force the vendor and manufacturer to perform according to the contract and bid specifications. The fact that the buses are on Guam is irrelevant because if DPW had rejected them at the factory job they would not be here.

In closing we are asking that GSA reverse the award on grounds that the buses do not meet the required specifications and the bidder failed to list their discrepancies as required by the bid. The failure to do so as stated in the bid is the rejection of the bid as non-responsive. In addition it is our position that the bidder and/or the manufacturer of the buses did not, in fact act in good faith neither during the bid

process nor after the award and their bid should be rejected and they should be suspended from participating in future Government of Guam school bus bids on these grounds. Finally Triple J should be awarded the bid as the most responsive bidder.

Alternatively if the government feels it is in its best interest to overlook all of these deficiencies and discrepancies, we would be willing to discuss a settlement to compensate Triple J for its lost income and opportunity as well as it extra expenses incurred in this matter.

This purpose of this letter is to file our official protest of the above bid opening for the following reasons.

1. Unfortunately the following statement in the bid package did not allow adequate time for vendors & manufactures to review the bid very detailed bid specifications and requirements. The bid was issued on the 15th therefore a 2-day period did not allow vendors adequate time for vendors to properly review the bid package or prepare any questions. In our opinion it is unfair for GSA to issue amendments to vendors after the cut-off date of which they are allowed to respond with questions that may arise from such amendments.

Bid Statement Reference: Page 2 of Bid Package: All questions and concerns shall be submitted no later than Aug 17, 2012 before close of business.

- 2. On August 20 GSA issued an Amendment which deleted the Reference to the Pre-Bid on P. 48. Since there was no date indicated, our acknowledgment letter stated "What Pre-Bid"? "Is There One"? We did not receive a reply to these questions. Additionally in our opinion it is unfair for GSA to issue amendments to vendors after the cut-off date of which they are allowed to respond with questions that may arise from such amendments.
- 3. On August 27 we attempted to summit a letter to GSA for request of additional clarifications of other bid specifications brought to our attention by our bus manufacture, however GSA refused acceptance of this letter on the basis of the cut-off time allowed for submitting questions. However on the same day Aug 27 GSA issued Amendment No 2 which requires DPW employees to travel to the factory to inspect the buses after completion. This amendment was also issued to vendors without them having the right to submit any questions or clarifications related to this request.

Re: Note on Specifications for our Primary & Alternate Bid: GSA-0116-12 (9-06-12) DPW 84 Passenger School Buses 5-Ea

Please note the following information pertaining to one of the bus specifications.

Listed under Body- P35 item 6 & 7:

Although it is <u>NOT A FEDERAL REQUIRMENT</u> Blue Bird Can install the Left Side Emergency Door, however this will reduce the seating capacity from 84 passengers to 83 unless a Jump-Seat is installed. If the Jump Seat is used the Passenger Capacity is increased to 86, however the space from the barrier would be 12 inches, not 20 inches.

We recommend, since it is not a federal requirement, to forgo the Side Emergency Door and the bus will not only have 84 passengers it will be one foot shorter than if with the side emergency door, 39 Ft vs 40 Ft. Keep in mind the bus will already be equipped with emergency rear door, emergency roof hatches, and emergency side windows.

Re: Alternate Bid: The purpose of our alternate bid is to reduce the total cost by \$31,335 by offering the government the option to forgo some of the requirements that are not a part of the Buses themselves. This is the full service diagnosis equipment, the engine and transmission on-island training and the factory trip. This in no way affects the Manufactures Warranty, or the Mechanical Servicing we will be providing.

The purpose of this letter is to officially protest the award of GSA-0116-12 and acceptance of the ten (10) new school buses recently received by the Department of Public Works for GSA

As a participant in the above procurement we are concerned that the buses received do not meet the following minimum required specifications:

1. Emergency Exits No's 1 thru & page 35 (Side Emergency Door)

Our bid included the Side Emergency Door, however we were rejected since it would reduce the passenger capacity from 84 to 83. We did however offer an "industry standard federally approved flip seat" which would have increased the capacity to 86.

 Construction: #3 The Body Panels are required to be fastened by anti-corrosive rivets. The buses received have Body Panels fastened by screws instead of rivets. This makes a substantial difference in the construction.

An additional requirement per Amendment #2 was for two DPW personnel to travel (bidder expenses paid) to the bus manufacturer for (4) Days for the purpose of inspecting the buses for "workmanship, quality conformance, first production vehicle". In light of the visit we are wondering why these deficiencies were not noted during the inspection and prior to shipment to Guam.

I am sure you can understand our frustration that our bid was rejected for a specification that was, in the end not provided by the winning bidder.

I look forward to your reply and resolution to this matter.

Dear Mr. Jones:

I am in receipt of your protest in regards to GSA Bid No. 0116-12, School Buses for the Department of Public Works. In your protest, you indicated that you were willing to offer a side emergency door that did not offer an 84 seat capacity, but rather an 83 seat capacity. Secondly, you indicated that you offered as an alternative, an "industry standard federally approved flip seat", which would offer 86 seat capacity.

Your second point was that buses that have arrived have body panels fastened by screws instead of rivets as required in the bid specifications.

Further you indicated that two (2) DPW personnel who were to travel to the bus manufacturer for the purpose of inspecting the buses did not catch these deficiencies and as such, where not noted prior to shipment to Guam.

Response to Inquiry No. 1: The Department of Public Works determined that its major need was for an 84 seat bus. The Department did not want a "flip seat" as they viewed such seating as more dangerous and less appropriate for use. The side door that is missing from the buses that are being accepted, have an upper emergency door exit, which they felt was a reasonable.

Response to Inquiry No. 2 In discussion with the Director of the Department of Public Works, he acknowledges that this was an oversight by his office in addressing this issue while the buses were at the manufacturer's even though it was raised by the DPW personnel on site.

Response to Inquiry No. 3: The DPW personnel who were sent to the Bus Manufacturer did catch errors. However, the errors were not fixed.

COMMITED TO EXCELLENCE

You are correct in pointing out that 1) the buses do not have a side door and 2) the changing the side door to an upper door, and the rivets to a screw were a deviation from the contract. However, none of the required items were deleted from the bus. The only change that was made was moving the side doors to the roof of the bus. Secondly the objecting of the rivets was identified by the two (2) DPW personnel that conducted an on-site or final inspection at the manufacturer's, however, upon inspection the buses arrived in Guam, the screws were not corrected by the manufacturer. However, since your protest was filed after the bid was awarded, your remedies are limited to that of Remedies After Award as stated in 5 GCA Section 5452. The bidder has not acted fraudulently or in bad faith, the contract is ratified as it is determined that it is in the best interest of the Territory.

You have the right to seek any administrative or judicial review authorized by law upon receipt of this notice.

With respect to GSA's June 04, 2013 response to our Protest Letter of GSA Bid No. 0116-12 for School Buses, it seems the following facts and discrepancies may not have been fully understood by GSA. Please allow me to clarify.

With regard to the required side emergency door which is stated to have been "replaced with an upper emergency door exit" this cannot be the case as there is no such thing as an "upper emergency door". The only emergency safety devices on the roof are the required roof hatches referenced on page 35 & 36 of the bid specifications under, "Additional Emergency Exits". These roof hatches are not doors and, because of their distance from the floor, can only be used by children if the bus has fallen onto its side. If there were a fire or other emergency situation the children would not be able to safely use a "roof hatch" as an emergency exit.

Triple J's bid proposal included these required emergency roof hatches as well as the required Emergency Side Doors, (2) on each side, and the Required Rear Emergency Door. If Triple J had known that the side emergency exit requirements were going to be waived and not actually required as stated in the bid we could have offered a bus that met the 84 seat capacity without the need for a flip seat. However in order to comply with the emergency side door safety requirement AND still comply with the 84 seat capacity we had no choice but to offer the flip up seat option - which was the only reason our bid was rejected.

You also mention in your response that DPW determined that the flip up seats "were more dangerous and less appropriate for use". Please be advised that the flip seats are federally approved for use in school buses and are not dangerous at all. In fact flip seats with an emergency side exit are much safer than regular seats without any emergency side exits. Regardless of the importance, and potential safety issues involved, the side exits were still not provided by the awarded vendor. This is a fundamental deviation from the basic safety requirements of the bid specifications that should not be permitted by GSA.

With regard to the rivet vs. screw issue, the explanation that this was an issue that was identified by the inspectors but was not corrected by the manufacturer cannot be accurate based on our research. Thomas uses screws in the manufacturing of their buses. They do not build buses with outside rivets - it is simply not part of the engineering or design of their products. Therefore they could not have agreed to correct this issue when discovered by the inspectors.

With regards to our protest being filed after the award, we believed that GSA would only award the bid if the vendor complied with all specifications. It was only after the buses arrived on island that we became aware of the discrepancies. We immediately filed our protest at that time.

Lastly we feel that the statement that "the bidder did not act fraudulently or in bad faith" may not be accurate. The bidder knew that their configuration did not offer side exits and they knew that their bus was not built with screws instead of rivets as required by the bid. As the authorized representative of their manufacturer, these issues would have been clear to them. Despite evidence to the contrary, we still contend that lack of fraud or bad faith is not justification for GSA or DPW to accept tax payer funded vehicles that do not meet minimum bid requirements, especially when the specifications are safety and construction related.

In closing we ask that GSA and DPW reject the buses for delivery until or unless the bidder can correct the deficiencies. If the deficiencies cannot be corrected the bid should be awarded to Triple J as the most responsible bidder.
