2.2.5 - BID SUBMISSION FORM

Determination of an award pursuant to this IFB will be made based on the *lowest responsive and responsible bidder*. GDOE reserves the right to disqualify bids that are deemed to be nonresponsive, regardless of whether the bid is determined to contain the lowest price.

In determining the lowest responsive bidder, GDOE will be guided by the following evaluation factors:

2.5 - GENERAL INFORMATION

2.5.1 - INDEFINITE QUANTITY PROCUREMENT/BID

This procurement is for an indefinite amount of Laptops, Mobile Labs, Laptops with Docking Stations and Desktop Computers described above in Section 2.1.3 – Purchase Description and Project Scope, and these supplies should be furnished, in this case, as ordered. The objective of this, indefinite quantity bid is to establish a fixed-price for any Laptops, Mobile Labs, Laptops with Docking Stations, and Desktop Computers the Department may require for December 30, 2012. Due to fluctuation in needs, these quantities may increase during the course of the contract period. This IFB is seeking bids from bidders who are able to provide the quantity of Laptops and Mobile Labs stated in Section 2.1.3 – Purchase Description and Project Scope, in addition to quantities the Department may determine it needs in the future. Regardless of future needs and fluctuations therein, this contract shall be subject to the availability of funds. Bidders should cross-reference this section with Section 4 – ARRA and Section 2.5.8 - Requirements for All Solicitations Funded by ARRA.

2.5.2 - DELIVERY AND PERFORMANCE SCHEDULE

Full delivery of the goods and services being procured through this IFB is defined according to the following:

- All equipment in the initial minimum quantity order are to be fully received, imaged, and deployed to GDOE locations/personnel no later than 90 days from the receipt of the Notice to Proceed. All subsequent orders will be fully received, imaged, and deployed within six (6) weeks from the receipt of Notice to Proceed.
- Vendor and GDOE will agree on a tentative delivery schedule upon issuance of a purchase order signifying the notice to proceed.
- Vendor will deliver equipment directly to school site or a site that GDOE will determine at a later date. Final acceptance of installation and configuration is considered complete when the equipment is operational and all required forms and documentation is completed and signed.
- Vendors will be required to pre-fill an internal GDOE acceptance forms for distribution of laptops to GDOE employees to sign-off receipt of equipment. Forms will be provided to successful bidder at a later date.
- Vendor will give at least a 2-week written notice prior to distribution and delivery.
- All deliveries will be coordinated with GDOE Property office, FSAIS and school representative.
- Vendor will provide an electronic copy of inventory to the GDOE Property office, school, and to FSAIS prior to delivery as well as a CSV/MSExcel 2003 file.
- All shipping and packaging materials are the responsibility of the vendor. Vendor is responsible

 Delivery and performance will be complete when teachers have received their laptops and all documents required by GDOE/FSAIS are received.

Mobile Computer Labs:

- All laptops in their specific cart must be configured to connect to the Mobile cart's wireless device.
- All Mobile Labs must be fully assembled upon final delivery at the school site and is fully
 operational including the laptops connecting to the Mobile lab's wireless access point.
- Mobile labs will be delivered to various GDOE schools determined by FSAIS.

2.5.3 - METHOD OF PAYMENT

Vendor shall submit invoices in the following manner:

- The first invoice shall be submitted upon the full delivery of the first 300 Computer Hardware Systems.
- Subsequent invoices shall be submitted upon the next subsequent full deliveries of 300 or more Computer Hardware Systems.
- The final invoice shall be submitted upon the full delivery of the remainder of the computer hardware systems.

2.5.4 - INSPECTION AND ACCEPTANCE OF GOODS

Bidders submitting bids in response to this IFB should be aware that GDOE will inspect and test all goods, supplies, materials or equipment delivered in response to this IFB. GDOE reserves the right to reject and, at its discretion, require replacement of those items that are determined to be defective in material, construction, workmanship, manufacturing, or performance and/or that do not conform to the specifications described in this IFB.

2.5.5 - BOND REQUIREMENTS AND PERFORMANCE GUARANTEES

2.5.5.1 - BID BOND REQUIREMENTS FOR CONTRACT AMOUNTS IN EXCESS OF \$25,000.00

Bids that will result in a contract amount in excess of \$25,000.00 must meet the bid guarantee requirements below:

3.11 - PROHIBITION AGAINST EMPLOYMENT OF SEX OFFENDERS

Any entity providing services pursuant to this IFB is prohibited from employing sex offenders to provide the goods or services procured through this IFB. Such prohibition is made pursuant to 5 GCA § 5253, which states,

§5253. Restriction Against Contractors Employing Convicted Sex Offenders from Working at Government of Guam Venues.

- (a) No person convicted of a sex offense under the provisions of Chapter 25 of Title 9 Guam Code Annotated, or an offense as defined in Article 2 of Chapter 28, Title 9 GCA in Guam, or an offense in any jurisdiction which includes, at a minimum, all of the elements of said offenses, or who is listed on the Sex Offender Registry, and who is employed by a business contracted to perform services for an agency or instrumentality of the government of Guam, shall work for his employer on the property of the government of Guam other than a public highway.
- (b) All contracts for services to agencies listed herein shall include the following provisions: (1) warranties that no person providing services on behalf of the contractor has been convicted of a sex offense under the provisions of Chapter 25 of Title 9 GCA or an offense as defined in Article 2 of Chapter 28, Title 9 GCA, or an offense in another jurisdiction with, at a minimum, the same elements as such offenses, or who is listed on the Sex Offender Registry; and (2) that if any person providing services on behalf of the contractor is convicted of a sex offense under the provisions of Chapter 25 of Title 9 GCA or an offense as defined in Article 2 of Chapter 28, Title 9 GCA or an offense in another jurisdiction with, at a minimum, the same elements as such offenses, or who is listed on the Sex Offender Registry, that such person will be immediately removed from working at said agency and that the administrator of said agency be informed of such within twenty-four (24) hours of such conviction.
- (d) any contractor found in violation of §5253(b), after notice from the contracting authority of such violation, shall, within twenty-four (24) hours, take corrective action and shall report such action to the contracting authority. Failure to take corrective action within the stipulated period may result in the temporary suspension of the contract at the discretion of the contracting authority.

3.12 - WAGE AND BENEFITS DETERMINATION FOR SERVICES

3.13 - MANDATORY DISPUTES CLAUSE (2 GAR DIV. 4 § 9103(g))

In accordance with Guam procurement law, all controversies between the territory and the Contractor which arise under, or by virtue of, this contract which are not resolved by mutual agreement, shall be decided by the GDOE procurement officer in writing, within 60 days after written request by the Contractor for a final decision concerning the controversy; provided however that if the procurement officer does not issue a written decision within 60 days after written request for a final decision, or within such longer period as may be agreed upon by the parties, then the Contractor may proceed as if an adverse decision had been received. The procurement officer shall immediately furnish a copy of the decision to the Contractor, by certified mail, return receipt requested, or by any other method that provides evidence of receipt. Any such decision shall be final and conclusive, unless fraudulent, or the Contractor brings an action seeking review of the decision before the Guam Office of Public Accountability. The Contractor shall comply with any decision of the procurement officer and proceed diligently with performance of this contract pending final resolution by the Office of Public Accountability or the Superior Court of Guam of any controversy arising under or by virtue of this Contract except where there has been a material breach of the contract by GDOE; provided, however, that in any event the Contractor shall proceed diligently with the performance of the contract where GDOE has made a written determination that continuation of work under the contract is essential to public health and safety.

Section 4 – REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL SOLICITATIONS FUNDED BY THE AMERICAN RECOVERY AND REINVESTMENT ACT

4.1 – REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL SOLICITATIONS FUNDED BY THE AMERICAN RECOVERY AND REINVESTMENT ACT (ARRA)

 - i. 80% or more of its annual gross revenues in federal awards; and
 - ii. \$25 million or more in annual gross revenue from federal awards.
- f. Any other information reasonably requested by GDOE or required by Guam or federal law or regulation.

4.4 - SEGREGATION OF FUNDS

Bidders who are awarded a contract as a result of a solicitation that will be funded by ARRA must be willing segregate and refrain from comingling obligations and expenditures of ARRA funds from other sources of funding.

4.5 - TRANSPARENT USE OF GRANT FUNDING

Solicitations and awards that will be funded by ARRA must be completely transparent to prevent the misuse and misappropriation of the funds. All payments made in connection with this solicitation and any award granted thereof will be publicly reported online at http://www.federalreporting.gov.

4.6 - ACCESS TO RECORDS

Bidders who are awarded a contract as a result of a solicitation that will be funded by ARRA must be willing to participate in, either scheduled or unannounced, interviews and examinations of any pertinent books, documents, paper, and records of bidder related to bidder's charges and performance under this award by officials from GDOE (sub-grantee), the Guam Public Auditor's Office (grantee's state auditor), the Office of the Governor of Guam (grantee), the United States Department of Education (grantor), the Office of Inspector General, and Government Auditing/Accountability Office (GAO). Such records shall be kept by bidder for a period of three (3) years after final payment under this award.

4.7 – ACCEPTANCE OF FUTURE REQUIREMENTS

Bidders who are awarded a contract as a result of a solicitation that will be funded by ARRA should be aware that the rules and regulations governing ARRA funding may change over time and additional compliance requirements may be imposed by the grantor.

4.8 - CLEARANCE INVESTIGATION

4.12 - REQUIREMENTS FOR WAGES PAID

Bidders who are awarded a contract as a result of a solicitation that will be funded by ARRA must comply with the following wage requirements:

4.16 - CONTROLLING PROCUREMENT LAW PER EDGAR

- 3) The contracting officer reviews the proposed action and promptly submits a report of the action, together with the agency's recommendations and pertinent information including the position of the contractor and the employees, to the Wage and Hour Division, Employment Standards Administration, U.S. Department of Labor, for review. (See section 4.6(b)(2) of Regulations 29 CFR Part 4).
- 4) Within 30 days of receipt, the Wage and Hour Division approves, modifies, or disapproves the action via transmittal to the agency contracting officer, or notifies the contracting officer that additional time will be required to process the request.
- 5) The contracting officer transmits the Wage and Hour decision to the contractor.

6) The contractor informs the affected employees.

Information required by the Regulations must be submitted on SF 1444 or bond paper.

When preparing a conformance request, the "Service Contract Act Directory of Occupations" (the Directory) should be used to compare job definitions to insure that duties requested are not performed by a classification already listed in the wage determination. Remember, it is not the job title, but the required tasks that determine whether a class is included in an established wage determination. Conformances may not be used to artificially split, combine, or subdivide classifications listed in the wage determination.



Windows 8 computers to go on sale in October

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Computers running on the next version of Microsoft's Windows operating system will go on sale in October.

Microsoft Corp. announced the time frame for Windows 8's mass-market release Monday in Toronto. A specific sales date in October wasn't provided.

Most industry analysts expected Windows 8 would go on sale in the fall to ensure that the machines running on the operating system would be available for the holiday shopping season. Consumers and businesses who don't want to buy new computers will be able to buy Windows 8 and upgrade their systems.

New versions of Windows typically come out every three years, but this update is the most widely anticipated overhaul of the software since 1995.

Applications will appear in a mosaic of tiles on Windows 8. Microsoft also designed the operating system so it can run on personal computers or touch-based tablet computers.

Microsoft, which is based in Redmond, Washington, plans to make its own tablet running on Windows 8 to compete against Apple Inc.'s hot-selling iPad. The company hasn't yet announced a price for its tablet, which will be called the Surface. It also will be competing against a variety of other tablets, including the Kindle Fire from Amazon.com Inc. and the Nexus 7, which is being released later this month by Google Inc.

As part of its efforts to develop more touch-based software, Microsoft also announced the acquisition of Perceptive Pixel Inc. The deal gives Microsoft access to technology used in large multi-touch displays for TV broadcasters, as well as government, defense, engineering and educational markets, Microsoft said.

Terms of the Perceptive Pixel purchase weren't disclosed.

Windows 8 is being counted on to help revive demand for laptops and other personal computers.

The operating system's versatility is expected to encourage leading PC makers such as Hewlett-Packard Co. and Dell Inc. to release hybrid machines that are part laptop, part tablet computer. Both HP and Dell have also indicated they plan to release tablet computers powered by Windows 8, thrusting them into competition with Microsoft's Surface.

Microsoft is releasing Windows 8 computer manufacturers during the first week of August.

The high hopes riding on Windows 8 is the main reason that Microsoft's stock has climbed by about 15% so far this year. The shares fell 28 cents to \$29.91 in Monday's early afternoon trading.

Windows 8 computers to go on sale in October

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Computers running on the next version of Microsoft's Windows operating system will go on sale in October.

Microsoft Corp. announced the time frame for Windows 8's mass-market release Monday in Toronto. A specific sales date in October wasn't provided.

Most industry analysts expected Windows 8 would go on sale in the fall to ensure that the machines running on the operating system would be available for the holiday shopping season. Consumers and businesses who don't want to buy new computers will be able to buy Windows 8 and upgrade their systems.

New versions of Windows typically come out every three years, but this update is the most widely anticipated overhaul of the software since 1995.

Applications will appear in a mosaic of tiles on Windows 8. Microsoft also designed the operating system so it can run on personal computers or touch-based tablet computers.

Microsoft, which is based in Redmond, Washington, plans to make its own tablet running on Windows 8 to compete against Apple Inc.'s hot-selling iPad. The company hasn't yet announced a price for its tablet, which will be called the Surface. It also will be competing against a variety of other tablets, including the Kindle Fire from Amazon.com Inc. and the Nexus 7, which is being released later this month by Google Inc.

As part of its efforts to develop more touch-based software, Microsoft also announced the acquisition of Perceptive Pixel Inc. The deal gives Microsoft access to technology used in large multi-touch displays for TV broadcasters, as well as government, defense, engineering and educational markets, Microsoft said.

Terms of the Perceptive Pixel purchase weren't disclosed.

Windows 8 is being counted on to help revive demand for laptops and other personal computers.

The operating system's versatility is expected to encourage leading PC makers such as Hewlett-Packard Co. and Dell Inc. to release hybrid machines that are part laptop, part tablet computer. Both HP and Dell have also indicated they plan to release tablet computers powered by Windows 8, thrusting them into competition with Microsoft's Surface.

Microsoft is releasing Windows 8 computer manufacturers during the first week of August.

The high hopes riding on Windows 8 is the main reason that Microsoft's stock has climbed by about 15% so far this year. The shares fell 28 cents to \$29.91 in Monday's early afternoon trading.





ALL OCCUPATIONS LISTED ABOVE RECEIVE THE FOLLOWING BENEFITS:

HEALTH & WELFARE: \$3.71 per hour or \$148.40 per week or \$643.07 per month

VACATION: 2 weeks paid vacation after 1 year of service with a contractor or successor; and 4 weeks after 3 years. Length of service includes the whole span of continuous service with the present contractor or successor, wherever employed, and with the predecessor contractors in the performance of similar work at the same Federal facility. (Reg. 29 CFR 4.173)

HOLIDAYS: A minimum of ten paid holidays per year, New Year's Day, Martin Luther King Jr's Birthday, Washington's Birthday, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Columbus Day, Veterans' Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day. (A contractor may substitute for any of the named holidays another day off with pay in accordance with a plan communicated to the employees involved.) (See 29 CFR 4174)

THE OCCUPATIONS WHICH HAVE NUMBERED FOOTNOTES IN PARENTHESES RECEIVE THE FOLLOWING:

1) COMPUTER EMPLOYEES: Under the SCA at section 8(b), this wage determination does not apply to any employee who individually qualifies as a bona fide executive, administrative, or professional employee as defined in 29 C.F.R. Part 541. Because most Computer System Analysts and Computer Programmers who are compensated at a rate not less than \$27.63 (or on a salary or fee basis at a rate not less than \$455 per week) an hour would likely qualify as exempt computer professionals, (29 C.F.R. 541. 400) wage rates may not be listed on this wage determination for all occupations within those job families. In addition, because this wage determination may not list a wage rate for some or all occupations within those job families if the survey data indicates that the prevailing wage rate for the occupation equals or exceeds \$27.63 per hour conformances may be necessary for certain nonexempt employees. For example, if an individual employee is nonexempt but nevertheless performs duties within the scope of one of the Computer Systems Analyst or Computer Programmer occupations for which this wage determination does not specify an SCA wage rate, then the wage rate for that employee must be conformed in accordance with the conformance procedures described in the conformance note included on this wage determination.

Additionally, because job titles vary widely and change quickly in the computer

- (3) The design, documentation, testing, creation or modification of computer programs related to machine operating systems; or
- (4) A combination of the aforementioned duties, the performance of which requires the same level of skills. (29 C.F.R. 541.400).
- 2) AIR TRAFFIC CONTROLLERS AND WEATHER OBSERVERS NIGHT PAY & SUNDAY PAY: If you work at night as part of a regular tour of duty, you will earn a night differential and receive an additional 10% of basic pay for any hours worked between 6pm and 6am. If you are a full-time employed (40 hours a week) and Sunday is part of your regularly scheduled workweek, you are paid at your rate of basic pay plus a Sunday premium of 25% of your basic rate for each hour of Sunday work which is not overtime (i.e. occasional work on Sunday outside the normal tour of duty is considered overtime work).

HAZARDOUS PAY DIFFERENTIAL: An 8 percent differential is applicable to employees employed in a position that represents a high degree of hazard when working with or in close proximity to ordinance, explosives, and incendiary materials. This includes work such as screening, blending, dying, mixing, and pressing of sensitive ordance, explosives, and pyrotechnic compositions such as lead azide, black powder

and photoflash powder. All dry-house activities involving propellants or explosives. Demilitarization, modification, renovation, demolition, and maintenance operations on sensitive ordnance, explosives and incendiary materials. All operations involving regrading and cleaning of artillery ranges.

A 4 percent differential is applicable to employees employed in a position that represents a low degree of hazard when working with, or in close proximity to ordance, (or employees possibly adjacent to) explosives and incendiary materials which involves potential injury such as laceration of hands, face, or arms of the employee engaged in the operation, irritation of the skin, minor burns and the like; minimal damage to immediate or adjacent work area or equipment being used. All operations involving, unloading, storage, and hauling of ordance, explosive, and incendiary ordnance material other than small arms ammunition. These differentials are only applicable to work that has been specifically designated by the agency for ordance, explosives, and incendiary material differential pay.

** UNIFORM ALLOWANCE **

If employees are required to wear uniforms in the performance of this contract (either by the terms of the Government contract, by the employer, by the state or local law, etc.), the cost of furnishing such uniforms and maintaining (by laundering or dry cleaning) such uniforms is an expense that may not be borne by an employee where such cost reduces the hourly rate below that required by the wage determination. The Department of Labor will accept payment in accordance with the following standards as compliance:

The contractor or subcontractor is required to furnish all employees with an adequate number of uniforms without cost or to reimburse employees for the actual cost of the uniforms. In addition, where uniform cleaning and maintenance is made the responsibility of the employee, all contractors and subcontractors subject to this wage determination shall (in the absence of a bona fide collective bargaining agreement providing for a different amount, or the furnishing of contrary

affirmative proof as to the actual cost), reimburse all employees for such cleaning and maintenance at a rate of \$3.35 per week (or \$.67 cents per day). However, in those instances where the uniforms furnished are made of "wash and wear" materials, may be routinely washed and dried with other personal garments, and do not require any special treatment such as dry cleaning, daily washing, or commercial laundering in order to meet the cleanliness or appearance standards set by the terms of the Government contract, by the contractor, by law, or by the nature of the work, there is no requirement that employees be reimbursed for uniform maintenance costs.

REQUEST FOR AUTHORIZATION OF ADDITIONAL CLASSIFICATION AND WAGE RATE (Standard Form 1444 (SF 1444))

Conformance Process:

The contracting officer shall require that any class of service employee which is not listed herein and which is to be employed under the contract (i.e., the work to be performed is not performed by any classification listed in the wage determination), be classified by the contractor so as to provide a reasonable relationship (i.e., appropriate level of skill comparison) between such unlisted classifications and the classifications listed in the wage determination. Such conformed classes of employees shall be paid the monetary wages and furnished the fringe benefits as are determined. Such conforming process shall be initiated by the contractor prior to the performance of contract work by such unlisted class(es) of employees. The conformed classification, wage rate, and/or fringe benefits shall be retroactive to the commencement date of the contract. (See Section 4.6 (C)(vi)) When multiple wage determinations are included in a contract, a separate SF 1444 should be prepared for each wage determination to which a class(es) is to be conformed.

The process for preparing a conformance request is as follows:

- 1) When preparing the bid, the contractor identifies the need for a conformed occupation(s) and computes a proposed rate(s).
- 2) After contract award, the contractor prepares a written report listing in order proposed classification title(s), a Federal grade equivalency (FGE) for each proposed classification(s), job description(s), and rationale for proposed wage rate(s), including information regarding the agreement or disagreement of the authorized representative of the employees involved, or where there is no authorized representative, the employees themselves. This report should be submitted to the contracting officer no later than 30 days after such unlisted class(es) of employees performs any contract work.
- 3) The contracting officer reviews the proposed action and promptly submits a report of the action, together with the agency's recommendations and pertinent information including the position of the contractor and the employees, to the Wage and Hour Division, Employment Standards Administration, U.S. Department of Labor, for review. (See section 4.6(b)(2) of Regulations 29 CFR Part 4).
- 4) Within 30 days of receipt, the Wage and Hour Division approves, modifies, or disapproves the action via transmittal to the agency contracting officer, or notifies the contracting officer that additional time will be required to process the request.
- 5) The contracting officer transmits the Wage and Hour decision to the contractor.

6) The contractor informs the affected employees.

Information required by the Regulations must be submitted on SF 1444 or bond paper.

When preparing a conformance request, the "Service Contract Act Directory of Occupations" (the Directory) should be used to compare job definitions to insure that duties requested are not performed by a classification already listed in the wage determination. Remember, it is not the job title, but the required tasks that determine whether a class is included in an established wage determination. Conformances may not be used to artificially split, combine, or subdivide classifications listed in the wage determination.

GDOE will provide only the Windows 7 upgrade and Microsoft Office 2010 professional licenses that will be used on the equipment. Vendor is responsible for all other software being requested.

b.) Minimum Image Deployment Requirements

The Successful Bidder must be capable of meeting the following minimum requirements for image deployment:

- To assist GDOE with creating an image that is compatible with the proposed hardware and software.
- To assign unique computer names for all computers based on the naming scheme provided by GDOE.
- To pre-image and load all computers at vendor's staging location before delivery to GDOE.
- To complete all required configurations and necessary installations to ensure the equipment is fully operational for the user.

Deployment will include, but shall not be limited to, the installation of drivers and applications; activating the operating system; joining the PCs to a domain; restoring/building new user data; and the configuration of user

profile settings. At a minimum, GDOE expects that the successful bidder will include enough dedicated, full-time personnel who will work on-island at various GDOE campuses or administrative sites for the duration of the contract.

- To provide labels for all equipment with a unique computer name and other information (federal grant requirements, etc) that GDOE will require and attach labels on top of each laptop/desktop.
- Additionally, the Successful Bidder will work with GDOE property office for Asset Tagging (GDOE will provide Asset tags).
- Will also be responsible for all staging and storage requirements until the distribution/delivery of equipment.

The Successful Bidder will provide the overall Deployment services approach for this IFB. At a minimum, the Successful Bidder must clearly identify the overall estimated deployment plan, deployment services to be provided, the staging location, the estimated time to create the image, the estimated time to image the Mobile Labs, and the time to account and deliver the equipment.

PDS acknowledges these requirements and will perform described work as a part of this procurement. PDS is uniquely qualified to perform the work involved in this project since PDS has over 40 years of experience in the computer industry and has worked very closely with GDOE on many other IT deployments over the last 10 years.

As required, the following describes our overall Deployment services approach to this bid.

<u>Deployment Plan:</u> PDS will establish a Project Team compromised of a Project Manager, Software Engineer, and Field Operations team leader. These individuals will work together to plan the work to be performed, establish schedules, be the point of contact for communicates with GDOE, and coordinate the activities of the PDS technical resources that will be involved in the project, as well as logistics with our vendors that will supplying the systems to be installed.

<u>Deployment Services:</u> PDS will provide the following deployment services:

• Discussion with GDOE regarding development of system configurations (IP Addresses, system setup/configuration, security, installation scheduling, software testing and loading, finalizing GDOE software image to be used for project).

- Ordering and shipping coordination for all phases of the project; initial order and subsequent orders.
- Receiving and asset tagging all equipment according to GDOE asset management instructions.
- Configuration of systems and loading Windows upgrade and application software images.
- Quality testing of all systems prior to deployment.
- Deployment of systems according to a mutually agreed to schedule with GDOE.
- Continued deployment of systems according to project schedule.
- Regular meetings with GDOE project members to resolve any issues, get feedback regarding improvements or issues. Work to insure smooth deployment.

<u>Staging Location:</u> PDS has access to 1,500 feet of office space within our existing Harmon office location. This location will be used to setup/stage/test systems prior to deployment.

<u>Timeline to create software image:</u> We estimate that the GDOE software image can be created within 30 days of approval to proceed. ACER has already agreed to send PDS test systems to be used for this purpose and to provide technical assistance as may be required by PDS to accomplish this task.

<u>Timeline to image Mobile Systems:</u> We estimated that efficient processes can be implemented to efficiently install the GDOE software images on the new ACER systems. PDS will evolve our workflow based upon our experience with the process once it begins. We believe once the project is in full swing that we can image/stage 100 systems a day.

<u>Timeline to Deploy Systems:</u> Based on GDOE's plan to order the systems in increments, PDS believes a deployment cycle can be established to have the system ordered, delivered, staged, deployed in a 90 day cycle (actual timeline will depend on the actual number of PC's involved in the deployment cycle).

c.) Documentation

The Successful Bidder must deliver all pertinent documentation, including:

 Inventory Records. Vendors will provide an electronic and printed copy of inventory items to the GDOE Property management office and the GDOE Financial, Student, and Administrative Information System also known as

FSAIS. Inventory records will include computer names, model numbers, serial numbers, GDOE fixed asset numbers, Name of GDOE employee laptops issued to (as applicable), School/department location of employee, date of issuance, descriptions of items, and purchase order numbers. All records will be provided in CSV or Excel 2003 format. This is to include all monitors and battery backup devices.

- Equipment Manuals. Vendor will provide equipment manuals that are relative to the equipment. 1 copy to each user, 1 copy for each product to FSAIS.
- GDOE licenses, license agreements. Vendor will provide all original license/license agreements to FSAIS that comes or is associated with the equipment provided.

PDS acknowledges these requirements and will perform all work in compliance with these specifications and requirements.

L. Non-Warranty Service for Laptops

GDOE is requesting for non-warranty services to protect the equipment from any events or damage not covered in the standard requested warranty. At a minimum, the coverage will include but not limited to accidental drops, spills, AND surges.

Please provide the overall non-warranty service plan for the laptops in the proposal. The plan should clearly identify its coverage (drops, spills, etc.) and the process to repair the laptops.

PDS will provide Non-Warranty service on an "as needed basis" to GDOE. PDS will offer GDOE fix price services for these repairs based on the type of repair that is required according to the severity of the damage or repair required. The following are the types of repair that PDS will make under this procurement:

Basic Technical Training: PDS will conduct annual technical training for qualified GDOE staff (up to 4 people) on the proper maintenance procedures and trouble-shooting for the ACER computer systems and APC UPS systems that we have recommended to GDOE. These training sessions will last for 4 hours and provide GDOE with basic technical knowledge required to perform basic non-warranty repairs.

<u>Evaluation:</u> PDS will provide evaluation of non-warranty problems and classify the identifiable problems into one of the following applicable categories. No chargeable work will be done on any units until PDS has received approval to perform the work.

<u>Simple repair:</u> cases where the problem can be resolved through trouble-shooting, configuration changes, disk/file repair, cleaning, or software reload. There repairs only involve labor of less than two hours and/or minor parts.

<u>Stage 1 repair:</u> Involves replacement of some major parts (DVD drive, AC power supply, Li-ion battery, main memory, keyboard/touchpad, and/or labor for troubleshooting and repair of between 2 to 4 hours.

<u>Stage 2 repair:</u> Involves replacement of critical system components (disk drive, LCD display, motherboard/processor.

All of the above repair work will be performed by PDS at its office location during normal PDS business hours. Repairs timelines will be 10 to 14 days after receipt of the unit for repair and identification of a PO to cover the cost of the repairs along with approval to proceed. PDS will provide an initial estimate of the repairs in order for GDOE to approve any work before charges are incurred. PDS will stock required parts on hand to insure timely repairs and all repairs performed by PDS will be warranted for 90 days.

M. Service Reporting — Warranty and Non-warranty Service

Successful bidder will provide monthly reports to GDOE FSAIS for the term of the agreement regarding warranty and non-warranty service. The report should include at a minimum the request id/trouble-ticket id, serial number of the equipment, diagnosis of the problem, and the repair/solution performed. The report will be in electronic PDF format and CSV/MS Excel 2003 format.

Any repair that cannot be completed within 30 days from the date of submission will result in an outright replacement.

PDS acknowledges this requirement and will perform all work in compliance with these specifications and requirements.

N. Cost breakdown







Summary Bid Form

Windows 8 computers to go on sale in October

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Computers running on the next version of Microsoft's Windows operating system will go on sale in October.

Microsoft Corp. announced the time frame for Windows 8's mass-market release Monday in Toronto. A specific sales date in October wasn't provided.

Most industry analysts expected Windows 8 would go on sale in the fall to ensure that the machines running on the operating system would be available for the holiday shopping season. Consumers and businesses who don't want to buy new computers will be able to buy Windows 8 and upgrade their systems.

New versions of Windows typically come out every three years, but this update is the most widely anticipated overhaul of the software since 1995.

Applications will appear in a mosaic of tiles on Windows 8. Microsoft also designed the operating system so it can run on personal computers or touch-based tablet computers.

Microsoft, which is based in Redmond, Washington, plans to make its own tablet running on Windows 8 to compete against Apple Inc.'s hot-selling iPad. The company hasn't yet announced a price for its tablet, which will be called the Surface. It also will be competing against a variety of other tablets, including the Kindle Fire from Amazon.com Inc. and the Nexus 7, which is being released later this month by Google Inc.

As part of its efforts to develop more touch-based software, Microsoft also announced the acquisition of Perceptive Pixel Inc. The deal gives Microsoft access to technology used in large multi-touch displays for TV broadcasters, as well as government, defense, engineering and educational markets, Microsoft said.

Terms of the Perceptive Pixel purchase weren't disclosed.

Windows 8 is being counted on to help revive demand for laptops and other personal computers.

The operating system's versatility is expected to encourage leading PC makers such as Hewlett-Packard Co. and Dell Inc. to release hybrid machines that are part laptop, part tablet computer. Both HP and Dell have also indicated they plan to release tablet computers powered by Windows 8, thrusting them into competition with Microsoft's Surface.

Microsoft is releasing Windows 8 computer manufacturers during the first week of August.

The high hopes riding on Windows 8 is the main reason that Microsoft's stock has climbed by about 15% so far this year. The shares fell 28 cents to \$29.91 in Monday's early afternoon trading.
