- The decision from which the Appeal is taken: On May 9, 2012, PDS filed a (g) protest regarding submissions or lack of, by GTA on GSA Bid Number 0 64-11. On October 6, 2012, GSA responded to the protest. The delay in the response was due to the fact that an appeal was filed by PDS on another portion of this bid (OPA-PA-11). Upon resolution of this appeal, the Public Auditor ordered that all of the protests be answered. GSA complied with the request. A statement answering the Allegation of the Appeal:
