THIS MATTER came before the Hearing Officer pursuant to Interested Party Marianas Variety Guam's (Hereafter Referred to as "Marianas Variety") July 23, 2008 Request for

 Disqualification of Hearing Officer. After reviewing the request and the relevant law, and pursuant to 5 G.C.A. §9222, the Hearing Officer has determined the following:

1. Marianas Variety's grounds for the Request for Disqualification are insufficient to show that the Hearing Officer cannot accord a fair and impartial hearing or consideration of this matter. A hearing officer shall involuntarily disqualify himself and withdraw from any case in which he cannot accord a fair and impartial hearing. 5 G.C.A. §9222. Administrators serving as adjudicators are presumed to be unbiased. *Allen v. Cuomo*, 100 F.3d 253, 259 (2d Cir., 1996). Further, the burden of overcoming the presumption of impartiality of an administrative agency rests on party making the assertion of bias, and presumption can be overcome only with convincing evidence that risk of actual bias or pre-judgment is present. *Navstar Intern. Transp. Corp. v. U.S.E.P.A.*, 941 F.2d 1339, 1360 (6th Cir., 1991). Here, Marianas Variety argues two (2) grounds for disqualification of the Hearing Officer.

First, Marianas Variety alleges that the Hearing Officer has an existing and ongoing business relationship with Appellant Pacific Daily News (Hereafter referred to as "PDN") due to the Hearing Officer's placement of advertisements for his private law practice in their newspaper, and that, based on this, the Hearing Officer's Impartiality might reasonably be questioned. Generally, recusal is not warranted for remote, contingent, or speculative reasons. U.S. v. International Broth. Of Teamsters, Chauffeurs, Warehousemen and Helpers of America, AFL-CIO, 831 F.Supp. 278, 286 (S.D.N.Y., 1993). Here, other than stating that the Hearing Officer advertises in the PDN's newspaper, the Marianas Variety does not state or show how such advertising gives the Hearing Officer any interest in the outcome of this matter to the extent that his impartiality is impaired or could reasonably be questioned. Thus, the Hearing Officer finds that the advertisements in the PDN in question do not prevent him from according a fair and impartial hearing in this matter and they do not create the reasonable appearance of partiality.

Second, Marianas Variety argues that the Hearing Officer has prejudged the issue of whether the PDN is the only newspaper of general circulation on Guam by publishing legal notices in other cases in the Marianas Variety and that a fair and impartial hearing cannot be had for this reason. Generally, mere proof that administrative official has taken public position, or

has expressed strong views, or holds underlying philosophy with respect to issue in dispute cannot overcome presumption that official is objective. Housing Study Group v. Kemp, 736 F.Supp. 321, 332 (D.D.C. 1990). Here, the Hearing Officer's publication of legal notices for his private law practice in the Marianas Variety only indicate that the Hearing Officer has taken a position that such notices are legally sufficient for the legal cases the notices are for, which are unrelated to this matter. The Hearing Officer finds that such public position or strong view in those unrelated cases does not prevent him from according a fair and impartial hearing in this matter nor does it create the reasonable appearance of partiality or prejudgment of any issue in this matter.

2. Based on the foregoing, the Marianas Variety's Request for Disqualification of Hearing Officer is hereby **DENIED**.
