THIS MATTER, came before the Hearing Officer for Procurement Appeals on March 5, 2019 for a hearing on the Appellant's Motion for Order to Supplement Procurement Record; Motion for Discovery that was filed in this matter on February 6, 2019. Keiko Bustamante was present on behalf of the Appellant and he was represented by the Appellant's Counsel of Record,

#### **BACKGROUND**

The Purchasing Agency filed the Procurement Record in this matter on January 11, 2019. The Appellant alleges that said record does not include a log of all communications between the government employees and any member of the public, potential bidder, vendor, or manufacturer which is in any way related to the procurement, and that said record does not include documents relating to the Appellant's bid submitted in response to the IFB from the Guam Power Authority (GPA), the Guam Waterworks Authority (GWA), the Department of Parks and Recreation of the Government of Guam (DPR), and the Guam International Airport Authority (GIAA).

Appellant's Motion at 2. The Appellant moves the OPA to compel the Purchasing Agency to produce these documents. Alternatively, the Appellant moves the OPA to require the production of those documents and any witnesses concerning them. Id., at 1. The Purchasing Agency contends that it has submitted the entire procurement record and the log of communications the Appellant demands do not exist. Purchasing Agency's Opposition at 1 and 3.

#### **DISCUSSION**

### The Purchasing Agency Must Produce the Log of Communications

The Log of Communications is a mandatory part of the Procurement Record. The Purchasing Agency must maintain a complete record of the IFB. 5 G.C.A. §5249 and 2 G.A.R., Div. 4, Chap. 3, §3129. A complete procurement record requires a log of all communications between government employees and any member of the public, potential bidder, vendor or manufacturer which is in any way related to the procurement. 5 G.C.A. §5249(b) and 2 G.A.R., Div. 4, Chap. 3, §3129(2). This log is important because it increases the level of governmental transparency by summarizing and recording both the "hard document" correspondence, and the

quieter, low profile (non-digital or print) types of communication such as telephone calls and in person meetings between the purchasing agency and the public, bidders, offerors, and potential vendors, and manufacturers. A well-kept log allows the public to quickly and conveniently understand what occurred between the purchasing and public in a procurement solicitation. This type of "big picture" understanding is very important because it promotes three underlying policies of Guam's Procurement Laws and Regulations which are to provide for increased public confidence in the procedures followed in public procurement, to provide safeguards for the maintenance of a procurement system of quality and integrity, and to require public access to all aspects of procurement. 5 G.C.A. §5001(b)(3)(7) and (8), and 2 G.A.R., Div. 4, Chap. 1, §1102(2)(6) and (7). Hence, the log of communications required by 5 G.C.A. §5249(b) and 2 G.A.R., Div. 4, Chap. 3, §3129(2) is not only necessary to have a complete procurement record but is also a very important part of the record for the policy reasons cited above.

A review of the procurement record filed in this matter confirms that Purchasing Agency's admission that it did not create the required and important log of communications. Further, the Hearing Officer has the power to require the parties to produce for examination those documents under their control and fix the time limits for submission of written documents in a matter pending before the Hearing Officer. 2 G.A.R., Div. 4, Chap. 12, §12109(c) and (g). Accordingly, the Purchasing shall supplement the Procurement Record in this matter by producing the log of communications required by 5 G.C.A. §5249(b) and 2 G.A.R., Div. 4, Chap. 3, §3129(2) and by serving the same on the Appellant and Interested Party no later than 5:00 p.m. on March 26, 2019. Further, said log shall contain any communications between the Purchasing Agency or its employees from GPA, GWA, DPR, and GIAA concerning the IFB if such communications occurred.

The Procurement Record does include a one page "Bid Submission Log" but this log is not neither comprehensive nor is it a log of all communications concerning the IFB required by 5 G.C.A. §5249(b) and 2 G.A.R., Div. 4, Chap. 3, §3129(2).

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#### **CONCLUSION**

Based on the foregoing, the Hearing Officer hereby GRANTS the Appellant's Motion for an Order to Supplement the Procurement Record.
