2.2. PURPOSE

The Guam Department of Education (GDOE) is seeking to purchase High Efficiency Particulate Absorbing (HEPA) Filtration System in order to support air quality in every classroom, office and enclosed common area (cafeterias, gyms, libraries, etc.).

2.3. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

3.1.2. ALL OR NONE

This solicitation is an ALL OR NONE BID and bids will be evaluated based on the lump sum price required in the bid form for this IFB. GDOE will not make itemized awards under this IFB. Requests for itemized pricing may be made by GDOE for the purpose of establishing unit prices for change orders that may be made to the Project.

3.1.3. ACCEPTABLE FORMAT OF BIDS

Bids submitted in response to this IFB must be made in writing and on the bid form(s) contained in this IFB. For each bid, bidders should submit one (1) original and two (2) copies for a total of three (3) documents. Bidders should also submit two (2) compact discs (CD) or USB flash drives containing a complete electronic copy of the bid submittal. 3.1.5. RECEIPT AND OPENING OF BIDS

3.1.6. BID SUBMISSION FORM

All bids must be submitted on the Bid Form included with this IFB. Bidders may type or handwrite in ink their responses in the blank spaces provided on the bid form. Bids submitted in any other format will be deemed nonresponsive and disqualified from participation in this solicitation. ALL SECTIONS OF THE BID FORM MUST BE FILLED IN TO BE CONSIDERED FOR AWARD.

3.1.7. IRREVOCABLE BID PRICE

Submitted bids must remain valid for at least ninety (90) days after the deadline for submission. Once awarded, prices shall remain firm throughout the term of this bid.

3.1.8. ALTERNATE OR MULTIPLE BIDS NOT ACCEPTED

Alternate or multiple bids <u>will not be accepted</u>. Any Bidder submitting alternate, multiple, or otherwise altered bid forms will be deemed nonresponsive and disqualified from this solicitation.

3.1.9. LATE BIDS NOT ACCEPTED

Bids received after the time and date specified in **Section 3.1.4 – TIME AND DATE FOR RECEIPT OF BIDS** will be considered nonresponsive and disqualified from consideration for award.

3.1.10. MODIFICATION OR WITHDRAWAL OF BIDS

Bids may be modified or withdrawn by written notice received from the Bidder prior to the time and date set for bid opening. Negligence from the Bidder in preparing the bid confers no right for the withdrawal of the bid after it has been opened.

3.1.11. TRADE SECRETS AND OTHER PROPRIETARY DATA

Bidder must complete and submit <u>GDOE Procurement Form 004</u> with the bid, whether or not the Bidder wishes to designate information within a bid as a Trade Secret or other Proprietary Information.

Blanket designations of confidentiality placed on the front cover of a bid will not be accepted as a valid designation of proprietary information. Every item, page, section or subsection that the Bidder wishes to designate as a trade secret or proprietary data should be listed on GDOE Procurement Form 004 and also **clearly marked** and **separable** from the remainder of the bid.

Prices, makes and models or catalogue numbers of the items offered, deliveries, and terms of payment shall be publicly available at the time of bid opening regardless of any designation to the contrary.



3.1.12. ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF AMENDMENTS TO IFB

This IFB may not be modified unless done by an Amendment made in writing by the GDOE Supply Management Administrator. Bidders must acknowledge in writing the receipt of any amendments to this IFB. Each amendment will contain an Amendment Acknowledgement Form. For each amendment, bidders must sign the Acknowledgment Form and return the signed copy via email or fax to GDOE. Signed Acknowledgment Forms for every amendment must also be included with the bid submission. **Bidders who fail to properly submit Amendment Acknowledgment Forms may be deemed nonresponsive and disqualified from participating in this solicitation.** Other than fax and email, Amendments and Clarifications may be downloaded or accessed through the GDOE website at <u>https://www.gdoe.net/District/Department/12-Office-of-Supply-Management</u>. Prospective Bidders are solely responsible for checking the website on a daily basis.

3.1.13. PRE-BID CONFERENCE

<u>GDOE may, at its discretion, conduct a pre-bid conference</u> in accordance with 2 GAR Div 4 §3109(g)(4). In the event a pre-bid conference is scheduled, GDOE will announce the time and place of the conference to all prospective bidders known to have received an IFB.

In the event that GDOE determines to hold a pre-bid conference, all potential bidders, that is all bidders who have requested and received an IFB packet from GDOE, will be informed of the date, time, location and requirements of the pre-bid conference. A summary or minutes of a pre-bid conference will be made available to all potential bidders.

At any pre-bid conference or site visit, GDOE may provide verbal answers to verbal questions from potential bidders. **AT NO TIME SHALL A VERBAL ANSWER BE CONSIDERED AN OFFICIAL GDOE RESPONSE.** All questions must be submitted in accordance with **Section 3.1.14 – PRE-BID WRITTEN QUESTIONS**. Only written answers may be relied upon.

3.1.14. PRE-BID WRITTEN QUESTIONS

Potential bidders may submit written questions concerning this IFB before the time and date listed below. Questions must be submitted in writing according to the instructions contained in **Section 3.1.1 – COMMUNICATION REGARDING THE IFB**. All questions and responses will be made available in writing to every potential bidder. Questions submitted after the time and date below will not be considered or answered.

3.1.15. EXPLANATION TO BIDDERS

No oral explanation in regards to the meaning of the specification will be made and no oral instructions will be given before the award of the IFB. Discrepancies, omissions, or doubts as to the meaning of the specifications should be communicated in writing to the named contact individual of GDOE for interpretation before the deadline for written questions specified in **Section 3.1.14** – **PRE-BID WRITTEN QUESTIONS**. Bidders should act promptly and allow sufficient time for a reply to reach them before submission of their bid. Interpretation, if required, shall be made in the form of an amendment to the IFB, which will be forwarded to all prospective Bidders.

3.1.16. BOND REQUIREMENTS, PERFORMANCE, AND PAYMENT GUARANTEES

Pursuant to 5 GCA §5212, **A Bid Security is REQUIRED for this IFB.** A bid guarantee or bid bond in the amount of not less than fifteen percent (15%) of the bidder's total bid price must be included with the bid. The bid guarantee may be in the form of a surety bond issued by a surety company authorized to do business in Guam, or in the form of a cashier's check, a certified check or a letter of credit.

If providing a surety bond, bidders are required to **submit the Bid Bond Form** - <u>GDOE Procurement Form 001</u>. Bidders providing security in the form of a bank certified check or a letter of credit should submit the check or letter of credit and a copy of same with the bid submission.

Failure to comply with the security requirements of this IFB shall result in a bid being deemed nonresponsive.



Surety bonds must be signed or countersigned in Guam by a foreign or alien surety's resident general agent. The surety must be a company, authorized by the Government of Guam and qualified to do business on Guam. Bids will be disqualified if the Surety Company does not have a valid Certificate of Authority from the Government of Guam to conduct business on Guam.

3.2. GENERAL INFORMATION

3.2.1. EVALUATION FACTORS FOR AWARD

Determination of an award pursuant to this IFB will be made based on the *lowest, most responsive and responsible bid(s)*.

GDOE reserves the right to disqualify bids that are deemed to be nonresponsive, regardless of whether the bid is determined to contain the lowest price. GDOE reserves the right to waive any minor informality or irregularity in the bids received.

In determining the lowest responsive bidder, GDOE will be guided by the following evaluation factors:

- a) Price of overall performance and delivery.
- b) Responsiveness to the requirements of this IFB.

Tie Bids: In the event GDOE receives lowest responsive bids from responsible bidders that are identical in price, determination of award will be made pursuant to 2 GAR Div. 4 §3109.

3.2.2. DETERMINATION OF RESPONSIBILITY

Responsibility of a bidder will be determined in accordance with 2 GAR Div. 4 §3116. Bidders should be prepared to promptly provide to GDOE information relating to the bidder's responsibility. Such information may include but is not limited to documentation of financial, personnel, and other resources; expertise; or records of performance. Failure of a bidder to comply with a request by GDOE for information relating to responsibility may result in a determination that a bidder is not responsible and therefore disqualified from an award.

Pursuant to 5 GCA §5201(g), responsiveness of a bidder will be determined by compliance with the requirements of this IFB.

3.2.3. NOTICE OF AWARD

Notice of Award shall constitute the official award of this IFB. Bidders submitting bids in response to this IFB will be notified in writing if their bid is determined to be the lowest most responsive and responsible bid. For solicitations over \$25,000, all bidders submitting bids will be notified in writing of the successfulness or unsuccessfulness of their response to this IFB. Written notice of award will be public information and made a part of the procurement file.

3.2.4. SPECIAL PERMITS AND LICENSES

The Bidder shall, at its own expense, procure all permits, certificates, and licenses and give all notices and necessary reports required by law for this IFB. Failure to maintain required licenses or permits shall be grounds for immediate termination of the contract.

3.2.5. CONTRACT TYPE

A Firm Fixed Price agreement will be consummated between the most responsible bidder and GDOE.

3.2.6. FUNDING SOURCE

This activity is administered by the Guam Department of Education (GDOE) - Federal Programs Division/Grants Office and funded by the U.S. Department of Education, Education Stabilization Fund II - State Educational Agency (ESF II-SEA).

3.2.7. DELIVERY OF GOODS

Bidder(s) who are awarded this solicitation guarantees that goods will be delivered or required services performed within the time specified. GDOE will issue a Notice to Proceed (NTP) and/or Purchase Order prior to commencement of the order. Equipment must be delivered within ninety (90) calendar days after receipt of Purchase Order.

Destination: Successful bidder(s) must deliver in accordance to the location specified on the GDOE Purchase Order.

3.2.8. METHOD OF PAYMENT

The successful Bidder shall submit invoice(s) to GDOE for payment upon **delivery of goods or required services** as defined in **Section 3.2.7 – DELIVERY OF GOODS**.



3.2.9. INSPECTION AND ACCEPTANCE OF GOODS

Bidders submitting bids in response to this IFB should be aware that GDOE will inspect and test all goods, supplies, materials or equipment delivered in response to this IFB. GDOE reserves the right to reject and, at its discretion, require replacement of those items that are determined to be defective in material, construction, workmanship, manufacturing, or performance and/or that do not conform to the specifications described in this IFB.

3.2.10. VENDOR PERFORMANCE

Bidder(s) who are awarded this solicitation may, at the discretion of GDOE, be monitored and assessed based on their performance. Vendor performance will be reviewed before, during, and after the supplies or services have been delivered or performed.

The GDOE Supply Management Administrator or his/her designee may meet periodically with the selected Bidder for the purpose of reviewing progress and providing necessary guidance to the Bidder in solving issues.

3.2.11. JUSTIFICATION OF DELAY

If the Bidder cannot comply with the completion requirement agreed upon, it is the Bidder's responsibility to advise GDOE in writing explaining the cause and reasons of the delay. GDOE may make a reasonable extension of time.

3.2.12. LIQUIDATED DAMAGES

When the Contractor is given notice of delay or nonperformance as specified in 2GAR Div 4 § 6101(8) of the Termination for Default Clause of this IFB and fails to cure in the time specified, the Contractor shall be liable for damages for delay in the amount of one-fourth of one-percent (1%) of outstanding order per calendar day from date set for cure until either the territory reasonably obtains similar supplies or services if the vendor is terminated for default, or until the vendor provides the supplies or services if the vendor is not terminated for default. To the extent that the vendor's delay or nonperformance is excused under 2GAR Div 4 § 6101(8) (Excuse for Nonperformance or Delayed Performance) of the Termination for Default Clause of this IFB, liquidated damages shall not be due the territory. The Contractor remains liable for damages caused other than delay.

3.2.13. PHYSICAL LIABILITY

If it becomes necessary for the Vendor, either as principal, agent or employee, to enter upon the premises or property of Guam Department of Education in order to construct, erect, inspect, make delivery or remove property hereunder, the Vendor hereby covenants and agrees to take, use, provide and make all proper, necessary and sufficient precautions, safeguards and protections against the occurrence of any accidents, injuries or damages to any person or property during the progress of work herein covered, and to be responsible for, and to indemnify and save harmless the Guam Department of Education from the payment of all sums of money by reason of all or any such accidents, injuries or damages that may occur upon or about such work, and fines, penalties and loss incurred for or by reasons of the violations of any territorial ordinance, regulations, or the laws of Guam or the United States, while the work is in progress. Contractor will carry insurance to indemnify the Guam Department of Education against any claim for loss, damage or injury to property or persons arising out of the performance of the Contractor or his employees and agents of the services covered by the contract and the use, misuse or failure of any equipment used by the contractor or his employees or agents, and shall provide certificates of such insurance to the Guam Department of Education when required.

3.2.14. TAXES

All bidders are responsible for any taxes or fees that may be assessed or due for performance of work or delivery of services pursuant to this IFB. Specific information regarding Guam taxes may be obtained from the Guam Department of Revenue and Taxation.

3.2.15. AUTHORITY TO ISSUE THIS IFB

This solicitation is issued subject to the Guam Procurement Act (5GCA Chapter 5) and applicable Guam Procurement Regulations.

3.2.16. COSTS OF BID PREPARATION

All costs associated with preparation of a bid in response to this IFB shall be solely the Bidder's responsibility. GDOE shall not be liable for any costs incurred by a potential Bidder for the preparation of a bid.

3.2.17. BID SAMPLES AND DESCRIPTIVE LITERATURE

Pursuant to 2 GAR Div 4 §3109(e)(3), bid samples or descriptive literature should not be submitted to GDOE unless expressly requested within this IFB. Regardless of any condition set by a bidder, unsolicited bid samples or descriptive literature will not be examined, tested, or deemed to vary any of the requirements of this IFB.

3.2.18. BRAND NAME OR EQUAL

Pursuant to 2 GAR Div 4 §4103(b)(v), Any brand names used in this IFB are for the purpose of describing the standard of quality, performance, and characteristics desired and is not intended to limit or restrict competition. Substantially equivalent products to the brand specified will be considered for award.

3.2.19. CANCELLATION OF CONTRACTS

Pursuant to 2 GAR Div 4 §3121(e)(1)(G), in the event of a cancellation due to unavailability of funds, GDOE will notify the Contractor on a timely basis, and Contractor will be reimbursed the unamortized, reasonably incurred, nonrecurring costs. If contract is cancelled for lack of funds, Government will timely inform Contractor; but that neither party's rights under termination clause are affected.

4.1. REFERENCE TO LAW AND REGULATIONS

Bids submitted in response to this IFB must fulfill the requirements identified in this IFB. Each of the forms identified herein must be completed and returned according to the instructions provided. The term "GCA" refers to the Guam Code Annotated. The term "GAR" refers to the Guam Administrative Regulations, Division 4, Procurement Regulations. Administration of this IFB shall be subject to the Guam Procurement Law at 5 GCA Chapter 5 and the procurement regulations at 2 GAR Division 4.

4.2. LIST OF FORMS REQUIRED FOR ALL SOLICITATIONS

Bidders must complete and submit originals of the forms identified throughout this IFB and collectively listed in Section 5 - FORMS REQUIRED IN RESPONSE TO IFB.

4.3. LAWS TO BE OBSERVED

The Bidder should be familiar with federal and local laws, codes, ordinances, and regulations, which, in any manner, affect those engaged or employed in the work, or the material or equipment, used in or upon the site, or in any way affect the conduct of the work. No misunderstanding or ignorance on the part of the Bidder will, in any way, serve to modify the provision of the contract.

4.4. LICENSE TO CONDUCT BUSINESS ON GUAM; POLICY OF LOCAL PROCUREMENT

Bidders providing supplies or services pursuant to this IFB are subject to licensure requirements in accordance with 5 GCA § 5008. Inquiries about obtaining a Guam business license should be directed to the Guam Department of Revenue and Taxation.

Preferential selection of a bidder licensed to do business on Guam and that maintains an office or other facility on Guam for an award pursuant to this IFB may be made in accordance with 5 GCA §5008. <u>GDOE Procurement Form 005</u> must be completed and included with the Bid.

4.5. DISCLOSURE OF OWNERSHIP AND COMMISSIONS

Bidders must expressly identify all major shareholders in accordance with 5 GCA § 5233. <u>AG Procurement Form 002</u> (Rev. Nov. 17, 2005) must be completed and included with the Bid.

4.6. BIDDERS CERTIFY THAT PRICE OR OFFER WAS INDEPENDENTLY ARRIVED AT WITHOUT COLLUSION

Bidders must certify that the submitted price or offer was independently arrived at without collusion in accordance with 2 GAR Div. 4 § 3126(b). <u>AG Procurement Form 003</u> (Jul. 12, 2010) must be completed and included with the Bid.

4.7. PROHIBITION AGAINST GRATUITIES AND KICKBACKS

Bidders must certify to the best of their knowledge that neither they, nor any of their officers, representatives, agents, subcontractors, or employees, have violated or are violating the prohibition against gratuities and kickbacks set forth in 5 GCA §5630.

4.8. REPRESENTATION REGARDING ETHICAL STANDARDS

Bidders must affirm that it has not knowingly influenced and promises that it will not knowingly influence a government employee to breach any of the ethical standards set forth in 5 GCA Chapter 5 Article 11 (Ethics in Public Contracting) of the Guam Procurement Act and in Chapter 11 of the Guam Procurement Regulations. <u>AG Procurement Form 005</u> (Jul. 12, 2010) must be completed and included with the Bid.

4.9. REPRESENTATION REGARDING CONTINGENT FEES

Bidders must affirm that it has not retained a person to solicit or secure a territorial contract upon an agreement or understanding for a commission, percentage, brokerage, or contingent fee, except for retention of bona fide employees or bona fide established commercial selling agencies for the purpose of securing business, in accordance with 5 GCA § 5631. <u>AG Procurement Form 007</u> (Jul. 12, 2010) must be completed and included with the Bid.



4.10. PROHIBITION AGAINST EMPLOYMENT OF SEX OFFENDERS

- (b) All contracts for services to agencies listed herein shall include the following provisions: (1) warranties that no person providing services on behalf of the contractor has been convicted of a sex offense under the provisions of Chapter 25 of Title 9 GCA or an offense as defined in Article 2 of Chapter 28, Title 9 GCA, or an offense in another jurisdiction with, at a minimum, the same elements as such offenses, or who is listed on the Sex Offender Registry; and (2) that if any person providing services on behalf of the contractor is convicted of a sex offense under the provisions of Chapter 25 of Title 9 GCA or an offense in Article 2 of Chapter 28, Title 9 GCA or an offense in another jurisdiction with, at a minimum, the same elements as such offense as defined in Article 2 of Chapter 28, Title 9 GCA or an offense in another jurisdiction with, at a minimum, the same elements as such offenses, or who is listed on the Sex Offender Registry, that such person will be immediately removed from working at said agency and that the administrator of said agency be informed of such within twenty-four (24) hours of such conviction.
- (d) any contractor found in violation of §5253(b), after notice from the contracting authority of such violation, shall, within twentyfour (24) hours, take corrective action and shall report such action to the contracting authority. Failure to take corrective action within the stipulated period may result in the temporary suspension of the contract at the discretion of the contracting authority.

4.12. EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY

Section 3.01 of the Executive Order 10935 dated March 7, 1965 requires the Bidder not to discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, creed, color or national origin. 4.13. MANDATORY DISPUTES CLAUSE

The procurement officer shall immediately furnish a copy of the decision to the Contractor, by certified mail, return receipt requested, or by any other method that provides evidence of receipt. Any such decision shall be final and conclusive, unless fraudulent, or the Contractor brings an action seeking review of the decision before the Guam Office of Public Accountability. The Contractor shall comply with any decision of the procurement officer and proceed diligently with performance of this contract pending final resolution by the Office of Public Accountability or the Superior Court of Guam of any controversy arising under or by virtue of this contract, except where there has been a material breach of the contract by GDOE; provided, however, that in any



event the Contractor shall proceed diligently with the performance of the contract where GDOE has made a written determination that continuation of work under the contract is essential to public health and safety.

Any disputes for expenses incurred in reliance upon this Agreement shall be subject to the Government Claims Act found at Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, Chapter 6.

4.14. DISABLED VETS: POLICY IN FAVOR OF SERVICE-DISABLED VETERAN OWNED BUSINESS

Pursuant to 5 GCA §5012, a bidder may qualify as a service-disabled veteran owned business if the following conditions apply: (a) the business is licensed to do business on Guam; maintains its headquarters on Guam; and is at least fifty-one percent owned by a service-disabled veteran who served in active U.S. military service, was discharged or released under honorable conditions, and whose disability is certified as service connected by a DD214 form and disability award letter from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs; and (b) the service-disabled owner of the business has filed individual tax returns on Guam for a period of at least three consecutive years prior to bidding on this IFB.

Notice of Service-Disabled Veteran Owned Business must be submitted with the bid by checking the appropriate box on the bid form and including a DD214 form and disability award letter with the bid form. The GDOE Supply Management Administrator will issue written notice to all bidders if any bidder is determined to be a qualified service-disabled veteran owned business pursuant to 5 GCA §5012. If a bidder is determined to be qualified under §5012, the requirements of 5 GCA §5011 shall apply to an award pursuant to this IFB.

4.15. RIGHT OF GDOE TO CANCEL OR REJECT BIDS

GDOE reserves the right to cancel this IFB at any time when it is in the best interests of the Department, in accordance with 5 GCA §5225 and 2 GAR Div. 4 §3115(c).

GDOE reserves the right to reject any bid in whole or in part when it is in the best interests of the Department, in accordance with 2 GAR Div.4 §3115(e)(2).

GDOE may resolicit for bids when it is deemed to be in the best interest of GDOE.

Please refer to our **Invitation for Bid No. 002-2022 High Efficiency Particulate Absorbing (HEPA) Filtration System and Maintenance**, a copy of which was obtained by your company for consideration.

Please see below response to questions submitted by Prospective Bidder(s):

Guam Pacific Enterprises Inc.

1. The drafting of the specifications should be drafted by Engineers, Architects Designers and draftsmen or those involved relative to the products and equipment being considered for the bid .The draftsmen are educators inconsistent with Section 5266 of CH. 5 of Guam Procurement law.

GDOE Response: Guam Procurement Law does not require that Engineers, Architects, or Designers draft the specifications.

- 2. The quantity is huge to be produced on time by one manufacturer due to component shortage and manpower. GDOE Response: GDOE has determined a scope or specifications to meet the needs of ensuring a safe learning environment for our students. Requirements will remain the same.
- The quantity should be spread to each school to meet the intention of Guam Procurement Law to entice more bidders and benefit all U.S. manufacturers.
 GDOE Response: GDOE has determined a scope or specifications to meet the needs of ensuring a safe learning environment for our students. This is an All or None Bid. The requirements will remain the same. Please refer to Section 3.1.2 of the IFB.
- Are you using Federal financial assistance Awards for this project, if yes then Buy American Act should be implemented to comply with the statutes and Executive Order. I did not see the Buy American Act. Provision *GDOE Response: This is a federally funded procurement. The system includes a U.S. Made requirement. Please refer to Section 6 – BID Form and Section 3.2.6 – FUNDING SOURCE of the IFB.*
- Who will evaluate the bids ?
 GDOE Response: There is an established selection panel consisting of project personnel, health/medical professionals and facilities & maintenance personnel.
- 6. Do the evaluators have expertise in engineering and designs ? GDOE Response: Guam Procurement Law does not require that Engineers, Architects, or Designers draft the specifications.
- 7. Do the draftsmen of the bid have experiences on the products or specifying the right product for school ? Because cheap is not always the right one . The noise of the purifier should be a major factor in the determination. **GDOE Response: The selection will be based on the lowest, most responsive and responsible bid that meets all material requirements stipulated in the IFB.**
- 8. Can we the bidder make our offer on delivery since we are the one coordinating with the supplier ? Delivery should be proposed by Bidders in my view and should not be the main factor in making the award determination unless there is a big gap in the bidders delivery offer.

GDOE Response: Delivery requirement will remain the same.

9. Can DOE break down the quantity of purifiers in every school to allow the bidders to bid on their manufacturers capacity ? It will provide business not to just 1 manufacturer but to several US manufacturers that is in line with Made in American Act by Pres. Joe Biden.

GDOE Response: This is an All or None Bid. Please refer to Section 3.1.2 of the IFB. The requirements will remain the same.

Did DOE remiss by requiring the 15% Bid bond under the Guam Law in the subject bid that is financed by federal financial assistance awards ? Argument. 15% BID BOND should not apply to comply with the Executive Order 14005 of President Biden Act. (Made in American Act)

GDOE Response: Bid Security is a requirement under Guam Procurement Law, irrespective of their funding source.

Johnstone Supply

11. Our question addresses whether GDOE would consider breaking down the various items in this section and thereby provide the GDOE Supply Management Administrator with the specific tools necessary to maintain the 2,467 Filtration Units in a cost-effective manner.

All units will not experience equal operating times nor equal dust loading, and therefore an effective maintenance plan will take such variables into considerations when planning maintenance cycles.

Some units may require Pre-filter replacement on a 3-month cycle while others may be extended to 6 or 9 months depending on loading. Ongoing monitoring and management of the entire system can establish the most cost-effective maintenance program for all units.

Also, UV Bulbs and HEPA filters have very long lifetime's ranging anywhere from one to six years. These are very costly items where replacement frequency can be very random

We ask the GDOE to consider a break-down of Item N°2, into the following bid categories.

(2.a would include the cost of travelling to the Unit Site, and assessing the need for any replacement; 2.b, c, and d, would consist of only the added cost associated with the installation of replacements once the technician is on site)

2.a. Labor and Transportation cost to perform inspection of Filtration Unit. Exclusive of parts supply, installation labor, and waste disposal.

2.b. Pre-Filter Replacement. Including filter cost, installation, and disposal of the spent filter.

2.c. UV Bulb Replacement. Including UV Bulb cost, installation, and disposal of the spent UV Bulb.

2.d. HEPA Filter Replacement. Including filter cost, installation, and disposal of the spent filter.

GDOE Response: The preventative maintenance requirements detail the general expectation of work to be provided by the bidder. All bidders are welcome to submit a detailed breakdown of the services proposed. The details of the preventative maintenance plan will be reviewed based on whether it meets the minimum requirements stipulated in the IFB.

12. The GDOE team responsible for drafting specifications may have relied on technical literature or brochures of certain brands that are not US Made.

Per Section 2.3. Project Description, Pacific Global Technologies submits a request for deviation. Per the "additional requirements" listed, the unit we intend to offer meets or exceeds all specifications, however may be manufactured outside the USA and made in China. Therefore, we request for approval to deviate from the US Made Requirement. GDOE Response: Unfortunately, due to the funding requirements, this cannot be done.

JMI Edison

- 13. 3.2.7 Delivery of Goods The COVID19 pandemic continues to disrupt the ability of many manufacturers impacting our ability to deliver products within normal lead-times. Supply chains are strained, production capabilities are compromised, and extreme port congestions have posed a major challenge in delivering our products to Guam. The 90day equipment delivery requirement would be challenging for all manufacturers & bidders. We would like to request for GDOE to amend and consider staggered deliveries for this IFB. This is to accommodate the abovementioned challenges. *GDOE Response: Delivery requirement will remain the same.*
- 14. 5 Year Preventive Maintenance of HEPA Filtration System (inclusive of consumables, parts & labor, and hazardous waste removal and disposal). Would repairs due to factors/issues outside of the manufacturer and bidder's control (such as natural disasters, misuse, power surges, rust, corrosion, vandalism, etc.) fall under this requirement? Please confirm. GDOE Response: Please refer to line item specifications on Preventive Maintenance. The preventative maintenance requirements detail the general expectation of work to be provided by the bidder.
- 15. Collaboration of Asset Tagging. Please provide more info and procedures relative to this requirement. *GDOE Response: The units will be delivered directly to each school site. A list of fixed assets will be prepared by the vendor, to include the assigned tag #, model #, serial # and per unit cost, school site and room (location). This list will be finalized in collaboration with our Property Division to ensure all items are in fact tagged and recorded.*
- 16. Additional Requirements 1 year Warranty including parts and labor. 1 year Factory standard warranty offered applies to manufacturer defects only. Any factors/issues outside of the manufacturer and bidder's control does not fall under the warranty (such as natural disasters, misuse, power surges, rust, corrosion, vandalism, etc.). Please confirm if this complies with GDOE's requirements.

GDOE Response: The warranty expectation is inclusive of defective parts (units) as well as any damages due to shipping and delivery and faulty install.

17. Section 3.2.7 (Pg. 8) DELIVERY OF GOODS. Requirement: "Items must be completed within 90 (90) calendar days after receipt of Purchase Order." Question: With such a large capacity order, specifically: 2,467 Units. The 90 day delivery requirement will be unattainable for most if not all bidders. To also keep into consideration, the extreme negative impact COVID 19 has had by majorly disrupting supply chain, logistics and shipping. We kindly request for GDOE to please reconsider amending current specification delivery of "90 days" to reflect "120-150 days" GDOE Response: Delivery requirement will remain the same.

Docomo Pacific

- 18. Bid Form indicates under "Additional Requirements" US Made requirement
 - a. Is GDOE using "CARES" funding? GDOE Response: This is a federally funded procurement using the Education Stabilization and American Rescue Plan.
 - b. Is this a Federal Requirement in use of the "CARES" funding?
 GDOE Response: The US Made requirement is expected for all federally funded purchases.
- 19. Docomo Pacific's Aura Air is made in Israel. Would this be acceptable? *GDOE Response: Unfortunately, no.*
- 20. Product is easily mounted, would GDOE still require casters? GDOE Response: The ability to mount the system can be an option, however it is not required. Portable, heavy duty, lockable casters is still a requirement.
- 21. Is mounting permissible: GDOE Response: Mounting is not permitted in several schools, so portability with casters is still required.

- 22. Would GDOE be mounting themselves or will Vendor be required to mount? *GDOE Response: If mounting will be done, the Bidder will be responsible for the delivery, installation and start up of the system.*

- 25. CFM Range (Minimum 500 CFM Maximum 1500 CFM). CFM rating should be specific or should be given at a specific minimum rating. If the bid specification will stay at 500 CFM, contractor will use the unit with minimum capacity. This will result to insufficient capacity for bigger room or space like Cafeteria, Gym & Library. GDOE Response: For clarification, the filtration system proposed by each bidder must at least meet or exceed both the minimum CFM range of 500 CFM and the maximum CFM range of 1500 CFM. GDOE committee will further review the specifications and accompanying brochure / descriptive literature provided by each Bidder to ensure that it meets the minimum requirements of the IFB.
- 26. In relation to previous questions, will GDOE only use one (1) capacity of unit for different size of rooms? If not, GDOE should provide quantity of units for specific size of rooms. Example: Rooms should be categorized by S, M, or L by their capacity 700 CFM, 1000 CFM and 1500 CFM or better up to 1700 CFM.
 GDOE Response: The number of units per schools site already factors in multiple units in larger enclosed common areas.
 GDOE committee will further review the specifications and accompanying brochure / descriptive literature provided by each Bidder to ensure that it meets the minimum requirements of the IFB.
- 27. Delivery time of 90 days upon Receipt of Purchase Order: Per manufacturer supplier the 90 days Delivery time is not enough for the production of 2467 units for Air Filtration System. In addition, all the manufacturer supplier in the Mainland, United States, experiencing a shortage of Raw Materials and factory man power shortage due to these troublesome Covid-19, Pandemic and another effect the congestion at the West Coast Port that caused the shipment delay to Guam. It is on this matter that we request 160 or 180 days Delivery time upon receipt of Purchase Order. *GDOE Response: The delivery requirement will remain the same.*
- 28. Section 3.1.16 Bond Requirements, Performance and Payment Guaranties. The Bid Spec, Section 3.1.16 did not spelled clearly or defined the Act, Pursuant to 5GCA Section 5212. See attachment of the chapter Act. Is this 5GCA Section 5212 is applicable to this Invitation of BID IFB-002-2022 as describe above.

My supplier ask me to request for consideration to submit our brochure — catalog, since the 10 officials of GDOE concentrated on the 4 Company's Brochures & Literature relied upon in preparing specifications on the GDOE IFB-002-2022 and therefore we appreciated your consideration to accept our company's Brochure — Catalog for equality and fairness to all. See attachment.

GDOE Response: Brochure and/or descriptive literature is a requirement for this IFB. Please refer to Section 2.3 of the IFB.

- 33. Option: Can Vendor may provide relatives to the above stated items. Further details for options must be put on a separate document and NO deviation on any part of the spec document and therefore NO disqualification to Bidder / Vendor. GDOE Response: GDOE does not fully understand the question. However, at minimum, Bidders must meet or exceed the requirements stipulated in the IFB specifications. A review of the Bidder's submitted brochure/descriptive literature will be done.
- 34. Early this morning I received a call In our supplier that their figures will ready sometime next week and I am afraid that the Insurance bonding don't have enough time to process and approve my request for bonding. It is on this matter that I would request to move the submittal date one to two weeks. For You and the board evaluators consideration. *GDOE Response: Deadline for submission will remain the same at this time.*

- 35. Would GDOE accept a longer ETA of 120 Calendar days after receipt of the official purchase order? The reason we asked is due to high demand the manufacturers are experiencing raw material shortages and supply chain delays. *GDOE Response: Delivery requirement will remain the same.*
- 36. Would GDOE accept a HEPA filtration system with the maximum CFM of 1800 and power supply of 115V/single phase? *GDOE Response: GDOE committee will further review the specifications and accompanying brochure / descriptive literature provided by each Bidder to ensure that it meets the minimum requirements of the IFB.*

37. GDOE Response: The use of the UV Lamp will be to inactivate or kill airborne pathogens and microorganisms like mold, bacteria and virus (specifically the COVID).

39. Will GDOE require High Efficiency Particulate Absorbing Filtration units offered for use at schools follow guidelines from US regulatory agency's such as the US Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the US Food and Drug Administration (FDA) on the use of UVC Disinfectant Lamps and to provide certification that units are either properly cleared or registered?

The request may or may not be approved.*

How is it possible for other products and vendors to compete, when the specifications are that of another product on the market? GDOE Response: The scope was determined based what is currently known about air safety in regards to the COVID-

GDDE Response: The scope was determined based what is currently known about air safety in regards to the COVID-19 virus and products that have been shown to be effective to meet our needs of providing a safe environment for our students. GDOE committee will further review the specifications and accompanying brochure / descriptive literature provided by each Bidder to ensure that it meets the minimum requirements of the IFB.

44. Please provide US Made specification. Are there exceptions to the US Made manufacturing requirements? I.e., can a product be engineered in the US and assembled in Mexico? Do all parts, assembly, and manufacturing need to be done in the United States? **CDOE** Responses At minimum, assembly, must be done in the United States.

GDOE Response: At minimum, assembly must be done in the United States.

- 45. Does engineered and researched and developed in the US, and assembled or made in China meet this specification? *GDOE Response: No.*
- 46. Are the CFM requirements a minimum of 500 cfm to be considered for these specs? *GDOE Response: Yes.*
- 47. Are the CFM requirements a maximum of 1500 cfm to be considered for these specs? Can the CFM requirement be at 1200 maximum speed?

GDOE Response: Maximum CFM range of the system must at least be 1500 CFM. GDOE committee will further review the specifications and accompanying brochure / descriptive literature provided by each Bidder to ensure that it meets the minimum requirements of the IFB.

- 48. The specification state a 59 decibel level for a CFM 1500 unit, we believe that a CFM of 1500 will produce a greater decibel level than 59 decibel. Are there acceptable variations for this specification? GDOE Response: No.

- 52. To consider a "High Efficiency Particulate Absorbing (HEPA) Filtration System", every classroom, offices, enclosed common area does not require the same filtration system. How can one unit cover all these areas, when other methods and products are available for consideration? For example, a smaller office room can use a different product, where as larger areas can use a different product (such as special aerosol disinfection methods) through the use of a HVAC system? In considering to use the entire same product in Large and smaller rooms should require different systems for aerosol disinfection, and not only the use of HEPA filters.

GDOE Response: Scope of work and specifications will remain the same.

- 53. Pg 8, 3.2.7: The delivery of 2467 units of required product within 90 days delivery and installation is not possible. With the current shipping and deliver status, a more reasonable time frame will be needed and considered. Can the 2467 units be divided into two phase deliveries? Estimated half of the units (1233 units) delivered in a certain time period, then the rest of the (1234 units) be delivered within the next reasonable period? GDOE Response: Delivery requirement will remain the same.
- 54. Pg 8, 3.2.8 Method of Payment. In expecting 2467 units to be delivered, and only upon delivery of goods, is when the vendor will be able to submit an invoice.

For such large-scale orders, if the "Estimated half of the units (1233 units) delivered in a certain time period, then the rest of the (1234 units) be delivered within the next reasonable period?" as stated above in 3.2.7, then can the vendors be paid for the first delivery, and then continue with the second delivery?

GDOE Response: Invoices may be submitted on work completed, while installation continues in other school sites.

b. Are there any other payment methods that can be considered by GDOE? GDOE Response: Purchase Orders, with payment processed for services rendered is the standard method of payment used by GDOE.

For purposes of IFB 002-2022 will Air Dog products qualify as MADE IN USA? GDOE Response: At minimum, assembly must be done in the United States.
- 56. The IFB dictates the use of HEPA filters. The Air Dog filtration system does not require a HEPA filter. Its purification/filter system will kill and eliminate viruses without HEPA. It removes 99.97% of all particles as small as .03 microns, meets the decibel threshold for operating noise at varied speed, and other requirements of the bid. This system is also washable instead of replaceable, reducing additional cost and downtime that is incumbent with HEPA. For purposes of IFB 002-2022 will the Air Dog filtration system meet the requirements of the IFB?

GDOE Response: At minimum, the system must demonstrate that it is capable of providing all necessary requirements of a HEPA filter and all other minimum requirements. GDOE committee will further review the specifications and accompanying brochure / descriptive literature provided by each Bidder to ensure that it meets the minimum requirements of the IFB.

57. Air Dog products are superior to other products because they do not rely on HEPA filtration. However, Air Dog products can be retrofitted with HEPA filtration components. Through an exclusive arrangement with Air Dog, this retrofitting can take place in Guam creating employment opportunity and economic benefit to the local economy. For purposes of IFB 002-2022 will Air Dog products qualify as MADE IN USA if HEPA filtration components are installed in Guam? *GDOE Response: At minimum, assembly must be done in the United States.*

Carrier

- 58. Does the equipment must be a High Efficiency Particulate Absorbing (HEPA) Filtration System? GDOE Response: At minimum, the system must demonstrate that it is capable of providing all necessary requirements of a HEPA filter and all other minimum requirements. GDOE committee will further review the specifications and accompanying brochure / descriptive literature provided by each Bidder to ensure that it meets the minimum requirements of the IFB.
- 59. Does the equipment must be Made in USA? *GDOE Response: Yes.*
- 60. The Pre-filter is suggested to be replaced more frequently. Could the service on this particular filter be adjusted to at least 2x/year replacement?
 GDOE Response: The preventative maintenance specifications details the general expectation of work to be provided. All bidders are welcome to submit a detailed breakdown of the services proposed. The details of the preventative maintenance plan will be reviewed based on whether it meets the minimum requirements stipulated in the IFB.
- 61. Do we have to process/facilitate the manifests, materials, equipment, labels, collection, analyzing, sorting, preparation, packaging, transporting, and obtaining Certificate of Disposal (COD) from the disposed hazardous materials to a regulated treatment/disposal facility in compliance with existing laws and regulations of the United States including, but not limited to EPA Hazardous Waste Regulations?

GDOE Response: In the handling, removal and disposal of the HEPA filter, the vendor must comply with all local and federal regulation relative to Hazardous Waste.

- 63. Is there any electrical works to be done for the installation of units ie. (wiring, conduit rough-in, disconnect switch) for the unit to be installed? GDOE Response: No.
- 64. Since most of the rooms at the school will be installed by the HEPA filtration system will the existing Electrical panel of the school can carry the additional loads? **GDOE Response: Yes.**

I am filing this protest for the following reasons.

1) Section 5266 of CH. 5 Guam Procurement Law was violated because it provides that architects, engineers, designers, draftsman will prepare the specifications.

Argument . The educators are the author of the bid that does not have experience on engineering ,designs and assessment of the quantity they need. per size of the classrooms and offices. The 2,467 pcs of purifier has no basis because the square footage of each classrooms and offices were not identified. The square footage will factor on the right purifier that the Bidders will offer whether it is for 400 sq. ft. or 800 sq. ft or more. That is why the quantity should be breakdown for each school with the sq. footage per classroom, offices , restrooms and other indoor places.

2) Section 5001 of CH5 GCA was not adhered to comply with the purposes and rules of construction. Argument. DOE imposed the delivery date that is unrealistic for the 2,467 pcs of purifier. How did they come up with 90 days delivery ? Did they coordinate with the manufactures in the mainland ? Delivery date should be offered by the Bidders not DOE.

3) 15 % Bid bond requirement does not apply to federal financial assistance awards bids. Argument . Bid bond is a Guam law . There is no provision that it applies to federal funds projects because Federal law supersedes Guam Law. It conflicts and does not comply with President Biden's Executive Order 14005 on Section 1 (Policy) and Section 3 (Review of Agency Action Inconsistent with Administration Policy. Guam Department of Education Mail - FYI -- Fwd: IFB No. 002-2022, Notice of Protest

4) DOE should not accept or deny Docomo's Aura Air product or other products since it is Made in Israel . Foreign products assembled in the U.S. does not comply with the Made in American Act. unless there are no US manufacturers that make the purifier. But DOE should adhere to Section 3 provisions of EXECUTIVE ORDER 14005 before granting any waiver.

I am respectfully requesting a Stay of Procurement due to deficiencies and inconsistencies with Guam Procurement law and President Biden's Executive Order 14005.

The same with the Purifiers, my manufacturer could only produce 200 pcs in 3 months or little bit more to maintain the quality. If DOE break down the quantity according to the needs of every school then I have to issue \$ 120, 000 bid bond in the form of cashiers check. Bid bond or Cashiers check that DOE will just keep in their safe and cannot be spent.

2) We are the distributor of purifier that supply the hospitals here in Guam. It is a proven machine that is also being used by schools and hospitals in the mainland. It is expensive than other brands but could last for decades if properly maintained and very quiet compare to others because schools in the US had tested different brands and selected our product ..

That is why it is essential to breakdown the quantity per school so that me and other bidders can bid according to our manufacturers capacity. The quantity of 2 thousand plus is just unrealistic for US manufacturers.

This is a written response to your letter of protest received on November 10, 15, & 17, 2021 regarding Guam Department of Education ("GDOE") Invitation for Bid No. 002-2022 ("IFB") for High Efficiency Particulate Absorbing (HEPA) Filtration System and Maintenance.

Based on a review of your protest <u>GDOE hereby DENIES your protest in its entirety for the reasons</u> <u>discussed below:</u>

1. Guam Pacific Enterprises Inc. (GPE) alleges, "Section 5266 of CH. 5 Guam Procurement Law was violated because it provides that architects, engineers, designers, draftsman will prepare the specifications. Argument. The educators are the author of the bid that does not have experience on engineering, designs and assessment of the quantity they need. Per size of the classrooms and offices. The 2,467 pcs of purifier has no basis because the square footage of each classrooms and offices were not identified. The square footage will factor on the right purifier that the Bidders will offer whether it is for 400 sq. ft. or 800 sq. ft or more. That is why the quantity should be breakdown for each school with the sq. footage per classroom, offices, restrooms and other indoor places."

Title 5 GCA §5266 states the requirements of this Article (Article 4) regarding the purposes and nonrestrictiveness of specifications shall apply to all specifications, including those prepared by architects, engineers, designers, and draftsmen for public contracts. In addition, Guam Procurement Law provides purchasing agencies the authority to develop specifications for the products and services sought by said purchasing agencies. Title 5 GCA §5266 does not require that Engineers, Architects, or Designers draft the specifications for this IFB. The specifications in the IFB were researched and developed pursuant to GDOE's needs as published within the

IFB, and in accordance with Guam Procurement Law. Specifications took into account the size and quantities of GDOE's needs.

2. GPE alleges, "Section 5001 of CH5 GCA was not adhered to comply with the purposes and rules of construction. Argument. DOE imposed the delivery date that is unrealistic for the 2,467 pcs of purifier. How did they come up with 90 days delivery? Did they coordinate with the manufactures in the mainland? Delivery date should be offered by the Bidders not DOE."

Guam Procurement Law, provides purchasing agencies the authority to include a delivery or performance schedule. In addition, GDOE's specifications as published took into account GDOE's urgent need of the HEPA filtration systems and to ensure a safe environment for its schoolchildren. In the event of a delay, Guam Procurement Law and the IFB provide authority to extend an agreement as well as proper justifications for delays.

3. GPE alleges, "15% Bid bond requirement does not apply to federal financial assistance awards bids. Argument. Bid bond is a Guam law. There is no provision that it applies to federal funds projects because Federal law supersedes Guam Law. It conflicts and does not comply with President Biden's Executive Order 14005 on Section 1 (Policy) and Section 3 (Review of Agency Action Inconsistent with Administration Policy."

Guam Procurement Law applies to every expenditure of public funds irrespective of their source, including federal assistance funds. 5 GCA §5004. In addition, Title 5 GCA §5212 regarding a bid bond, is a requirement of Guam Law and binding upon GDOE.

4. GPE alleges, "DOE should not accept or deny Docomo's Aura Air product or other products since it is Made in Israel. Foreign products assembled in the U.S. does not comply with the Made in American Act. Unless there are no US manufacturers that make the purifier. But DOE should adhere to Section 3 provisions of EXECUTIVE ORDER 14005 before granting any waiver."

GDOE has not received any bids yet. GDOE will only evaluate and award pursuant to the published terms and conditions of the IFB, and in accordance with Guam and Federal law.

5. GPE alleges, "If DOE will choose purifiers of high quality that is also used in hospitals and operate as if they are not working due to less than 50 decibels then we are talking about 8 million to 10 million dollar project. No supplier can produce the 2,467 purifiers in the imposed delivery date because of component and labor shortage. Also the quality of the purifier will be at risk. That is why the bidders should be allowed to bid on each school need because most of the manufacturers can only produce 200 units in 3 months. This will provide opportunity to all US manufacturers and spread the wealth not just to 1 manufacturer."

Guam Procurement Law, Rules and Regulations, provide the authority and guidance for purchasing agencies for the preparation and issuance of specifications for procurements. GDOE developed the specifications in the best interest of GDOE and its schoolchildren, in an effort to best meet its needs, and in accordance with the relevant laws, rules, and regulations.

6. GPE alleges, "We also bid on US projects to supply equipment, etc but bid bond is not required such as Military projects."

As stated above, Guam Law specifically requires a bid security for this IFB. This law is binding on GDOE, and GDOE shall only procure services and supplies in accordance with the relevant laws, rules and regulations.

7. GPE alleges, "In order to qualify for Made in America or Buy American Act, the product should constitute 51 percent US made materials or components, if not then even assembled in the USA does not pass muster."

GDOE has yet to receive bids for this IFB. GDOE shall only evaluate and award pursuant to terms and conditions of the IFB as published, and in accordance with the relevant laws, rules and regulations.

8. GPE alleges, "The 15 % Bid bond is substantially burdening the bidders like me which is inconsistent with the Executive Orders on the Made in America and Buy American Act. purpose and intentions. The reason is I have to produce Cashiers check in the form of Bid bond so that I can save fees and percentage being charged by insurance companies. Like for instance for the cafeteria tables I have to issue Cashiers check worth almost \$100,000 which DOE will keep until I delivered the tables that could be 5 months or more. The same with the \Purifiers, my manufacturer could only produce 200 pcs in 3 months or little bit more to maintain the quality. If DOE break down the quantity according to the needs of every school then I have to issue \$120,000 bid bond in the form of cashiers check. Bid bond or Cashiers check that DOE will just keep in their safe and cannot be spent."

As stated above, a bid security is required for this IFB pursuant to Guam Law. This law is binding on GDOE and its procurements. GDOE will only procure services and supplies in accordance with the relevant law, rules and regulations.

9. GPE alleges, "We are the distributor of purifier that supply the hospitals here in Guam . It is a proven machine that is also being used by schools and hospitals in the mainland. It is expensive than other brands but could last for decades if properly maintained and very quiet compare to others because schools in the US had tested different brands and selected our product. That is why it is essential to breakdown the quantity per school so that me and other bidders can bid according to our manufacturers capacity. The quantity of 2 thousand plus is just unrealistic for US manufacturers."

Guam Procurement Law, Rules and Regulations, provide the authority and guidance for purchasing agencies for the preparation and issuance of specifications for procurements. GDOE developed the specifications in the best interest of GDOE and its schoolchildren, in an effort to best meet its needs, and in accordance with the relevant laws, rules, and regulations.

Given the facts and reasons stated above, GDOE hereby denies your protest in its entirety. Pursuant to 5 GCA §5425(e), you are hereby advised that you have a right to administrative and judicial review as allowed by the Guam Procurement Law. You may appeal the decision to the Guam Office of Public Accountability within fifteen (15) days.
